**Research Analysis**

The Committee Substitute to SB 1442 modifies the requirements placed upon the Department of Corrections, the county sheriff and the county clerk regarding the reimbursement by the Department of Corrections for inmates held in the county jail after sentencing. The measure removes language requiring the transmittal of the judgement and sentence within business 5 days to the Department of Corrections.

**Fiscal Analysis**

SB 1442, which eliminates the 5 day limit for county jails to house an inmate before transferring to Dept. of Corrections (DOC) custody, may increase the cost for DOC. The costs for previous years for county jail backup are below:

The eventual fiscal impact is contingent upon how many days it takes for the counties to transfer the inmate. Currently DOC pays \$27/day to the counties per inmate.
