**Research Analysis**

SB 38 increases the Forensic Science Improvement Assessment from \$5 to \$10 for each conviction of any criminal offense, excluding traffic.

**Fiscal Analysis**

The ENGR version of SB 38 deals with increasing the Forensic Science Improvement Assessment fee from \$5 to \$10 on every criminal offense excluding traffic. Upon review from OSBI, this bill is estimated to increase the OSBI Forensic Science Improvement Revolving (220) Fund's annual revenue by approximately \$3.1 million. The 220 fund is a restricted revolving fund. The increased revenue will be budgeted annually for the purposes as authorized in Title 74 O.S. §150.35. This would free some GR and Revolving Fund 200 monies now budgeted for Forensic Services for budgeting in other operational areas of the agency.
