**Research Analysis**

The PCS for SB 615

SB 615 allows hunting of feral swine on private property, without a license, at night, with a vehicle and spotlight, while using night-vision equipment. If it is deer gun season, those hunting feral swine are required to notify the game warden. The measure also allows for removal of feral swine on public property and night hunting of feral swine on public property, both with a permit. The measure clarifies residency status of minors. The measure repeals the special permit that is required for private property owners to kill/attempt to kill depredating feral swing during deer gun and primitive firearm season.
