**Research Analysis**

The measure creates the “LCPL Trevor A. Roberts Memorial Highway” designation along a portion of Interstate Highway 44 in Oklahoma City and directs the Department of Transportation to place suitable markers bearing that name along the highway.

**Fiscal Analysis**

The measure directs the Department of Transportation (ODOT) to place permanent markers upon a number of highways and bridges bearing the name of the individuals to be honored. 69 O.S. § 1600 provides that the costs associated with signage related to the naming of highways and bridges is to be paid by the group sponsoring or requesting the sign, except in instances of naming a highway or bridge to honor members of the armed forces or Oklahoma Highway Patrol who were killed in action.

According to the Department of Transportation, the estimated cost to the Department is between \$1,000 and \$2,000 per location depending on the class of highway.
