**Research Analysis**

The committee substitute to SB 650 lowers the amount of time a non-violent offender must wait to seek an expungement from 15 years to 7 years. The amount of time is also reduced for persons who have not more than 2 nonviolent felonies by allowing the person to seek expungement if the person has no other felony or misdemeanor convictions within ten years of the date following the completion of sentence. The measure provides that expungements obtained under these categories without a full pardon do not restore citizenship rights including, but not limited to, rights to possess or own firearms and the right to vote.
