**Research Analysis**

The bill modifies eligibility requirements for a license to practice podiatric medicine. Beginning March 1, 2018, an applicant for licensure must complete a three year podiatric surgical residency to be eligible for licensure and within 90 days of completion of a residency to be eligible to receive a temporary license.
