**Research Analysis**

The bill requires radiologic technologists to be licensed by the State Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision and repeals a section of law that exempted the profession from licensure under the Radiologist Assistance Licensure Act. The Board will promulgate rules defining the scope of practice of radiologic technologists and the educational qualifications necessary for licensure.
