**Research Analysis**

The CS restores the title and restores discretion to school districts related to the completion of intervention and prevention programs for students who are guilty of violating certain acts.

The bill modifies the grade level for suspension of a student for assaulting or attempting to cause bodily injury to an education employee or volunteer from grade six to grade three. Additionally, it gives schools the discretion to have a student guilty of certain acts complete an intervention and prevention program with a mental health provider contracted with the Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services.

**Fiscal Analysis**

CS for ESB 81 modifies the grade level related to certain student discipline. Further, a school district may require a student guilty of specified acts to complete certain programs, if available or when necessary a mental health provider contracted with the Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services.
