**Research Analysis**

SB 89 increases the CLEET registration fee from \$20 to \$30 per day to cover the costs of breakfast, lunch and dinner meals provided by CLEET.

**Fiscal Analysis**

The ENGR version of SB 89 increases the CLEET registration fee for its academy by \$10 (from \$20 to \$30) for registrants and their respective law enforcement agency sponsors to cover the cost of breakfast, lunch, and dinner provided by CLEET for the registrant during their time at CLEET. According to CLEET:

“Currently, CLEET is authorized to charge up to \$20 for breakfast and lunch. CLEET is currently charging \$18 to cover these costs (breakfast cost is approximately \$6, while lunch is approximately \$12). This bill will allow us to charge up to \$30 for breakfast, lunch AND dinner (dinner cost is also \$12). We can provide dinner for \$12, while the agencies must follow their per diem guidelines for dinner. This amount varies depending on the agency, but should they follow federal GSA rates, they would pay \$23 for dinner. In this particular scenario, CLEET offering dinner for \$12 will save these agencies \$11/day for the 56 days their cadets are in the academy (\$616 savings per cadet). All money collected under this legislation is deposited into the Peace Officer Revolving Fund, which is restricted for peace officer education. This amount should be adequate to allow CLEET to provide three meals per day rather than two. To date, all money received under this statute has been earmarked exclusively for academy meals.”
