22 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
23 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1289.31 of Title 21, unless
24 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

- 16 10. The Corporation Commissioners;
- 17 11. Members of the United States Senate serving the State of
18 Oklahoma; and
- 19 12. Members of the United States House of Representatives
20 serving the State of Oklahoma.

21 Provided, however, state or federal elected officials shall be
22 specifically prohibited from carrying a firearm on any public or
23 private elementary or secondary school property that does not have a
24 policy that authorizes the carrying of firearms on the school

1 property, any college, university or technology center school
2 property and any private property or property owned by a business
3 entity that specifically prohibits persons from carrying firearms on
4 the property as provided in Section 1290.22 of Title 21 of the
5 Oklahoma Statutes.

6 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2017."
