SJR 35 proposes a Constitutional amendment which creates in the State Treasury a trust fund to be designated as the "Oklahoma Vision Fund" to support the operation of state government. For the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2020, and for each fiscal year thereafter, five percent (5%) of total actual revenue from the gross production tax on oil and gas would be deposited into such fund which percentage shall increase in increments of two-tenths percentage points (0.2%) each year thereafter.

SJR 35 proposes a Constitutional amendment which creates in the State Treasury a trust fund to be designated as the "Oklahoma Vision Fund" to support the operation of state government. For the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2020, and for each fiscal year thereafter, five percent (5%) of total actual revenue from the gross production tax on oil and gas would be deposited into such fund which percentage shall increase in increments of two-tenths percentage points (0.2%) each year thereafter.

The State Treasurer shall be responsible for the Oklahoma Vision Fund and for the investment of the principle of such fund.
