7	An Act relating to public health and safety; defining certain terms; excluding certain physician from
8	certain act; prohibiting person under certain age from using tanning device in tanning facility;
9	requiring certain notice in tanning facility; requiring customer to sign certain written statement;
10	requiring certain individuals to ensure certain requirements are fulfilled; setting forth certain
11	duties of person using tanning device; providing for penalty; permitting local ordinances to provide for
12	more restrictive regulations; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.
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15	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
16	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
17	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1-1431 of Title 63, unless there
18	is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
19	As defined in this act:
20	1. "Phototherapy device" means equipment that emits ultraviolet
21	radiation and is used in the diagnosis or treatment of disease or
22	injury;
23	2. "Tanning device" means equipment that emits electromagnetic
24	radiation having wavelengths in the air between two hundred (200)

- and four hundred (400) nanometers and that is used for tanning of

 human skin and any equipment used with that equipment, including but

 not limited to protective eyewear, timers and handrails. Such term

 shall not include a phototherapy device used, or prescribed for use,

 by a physician;
 - 3. "Tanning facility" means any location, place, area, structure or business that provides persons access to any tanning device, including tanning salons, health clubs, apartments and condominiums, regardless of whether a fee is charged for access to the tanning equipment; and

- 4. "Operator" means a person designated by the tanning facility owner or tanning device lessee to operate or to assist and instruct in the operation and use of the tanning facility or tanning device.
- SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1-1431.1 of Title 63, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
- This act shall not apply to any physician who is duly licensed to practice medicine in this state and who, in the practice of medicine, uses or prescribes to be used a phototherapy device with respect to a patient of any age.
- SECTION 3. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1-1431.2 of Title 63, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

It shall be unlawful for a person under eighteen (18) years of age to use any tanning device of any tanning facility in this state.

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SECTION 4. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1-1431.3 of Title 63, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

A person who is the owner, lessee or operator of a tanning facility shall post in a conspicuous place in each tanning facility owned, leased or operated by that person in this state a notice, available on the State Department of Health's website, that states all of the following:

- 1. That it is unlawful for a tanning facility or operator to allow a person under eighteen (18) years of age to use any tanning device;
- 2. That a tanning facility or operator that violates one or more provisions of this section may be subject to a civil penalty;
- 3. That an individual may report a violation of one or more provisions of this section to the local law enforcement agency; and
- 4. That health risks associated with tanning include but are not limited to skin cancer, premature aging of skin, burns to the skin and adverse reactions to certain medications, foods and cosmetics.
- SECTION 5. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1-1431.4 of Title 63, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

A person who is the owner, lessee or operator of a tanning facility shall give to each of its customers a written statement which must be signed by the customer before initial use and each year thereafter. The statement will be developed by the State Department of Health and must contain the following:

- 1. Written warning statement containing the same information in Section 4 of this act;
- 2. Acknowledgment signed by each user indicating that he or she understands the notice and warnings in Section 4 of this act; and
 - 3. Agreement that the user will use protective eyewear.
- SECTION 6. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1-1431.5 of Title 63, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

The owner, lessee or operator of a tanning facility shall ensure that all of the following requirements are fulfilled:

- 1. No customer under eighteen (18) years of age is permitted to use the tanning facility. Proof of age may be satisfied with a driver license or other government-issued identification containing the date of birth and photograph of the individual;
- 2. During operating hours there is present at the tanning facility a trained operator who is able to inform customers about, and assist customers in, the proper use of tanning devices;
 - 3. Each tanning device is properly sanitized after each use;

4. Each customer, before he or she begins to use a tanning device, is provided at no cost with properly sanitized and securely fitting protective eyewear that protects the wearer's eyes from ultraviolet radiation and allows enough vision to maintain balance;

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- 5. Customers are not allowed to use a tanning device unless the customer uses protective eyewear;
- 6. Each tanning device is equipped with a mechanism that allows the customer to turn the tanning device off;
- 7. Each customer is limited to the maximum exposure time recommended by the manufacturer for his or her skin type;
- 8. Customers are not allowed to use a tanning device more than once every twenty-four (24) hours;
- 9. The interior temperature of the tanning facility does not exceed one hundred (100) degrees Fahrenheit; and
- 10. The following records are maintained: copies of all consent forms signed by customers; a record of each customer's total number of tanning visits at the facility; the dates and durations of tanning exposures; and any injury reports for a period of three (3) years after exposure for each customer.
- SECTION 7. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1-1431.6 of Title 63, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
- No person may use a tanning device of a tanning facility unless he or she complies with the following:

- 1. Immediately before the customer's first use of a unique tanning facility in a year, the customer signs a statement acknowledging that he or she has read and understands the notice and the warning sign required under this section and specifying that the customer agrees to use protective eyewear; and
- 2. The customer uses protective eyewear at all times while using a tanning device.
- SECTION 8. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1-1431.7 of Title 63, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
- Any owner or operator who violates a provision of this section or any ordinance adopted thereunder may be subject to a penalty of not more than One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) for the first violation and not more than Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00) for any subsequent violation.
- SECTION 9. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1-1431.8 of Title 63, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
- This act does not preempt local ordinances which provide for more restrictive regulation of tanning facilities than required in these sections.
- SECTION 10. This act shall become effective November 1, 2017.

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
