13	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
14	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY Section 30, Chapter 366, O.S.L.
15	2016 (37A O.S. Supp. 2018, Section 2-118), is amended to read as
16	follows:
17	Section 2-118. A. An airline/railroad/commercial vessel
18	beverage license shall authorize the holder thereof:
19	1. To sell or serve alcoholic beverages in or from any size
20	container on a commercial passenger airplane <u>, vessel</u> or railroad
21	operated in compliance with a valid license, permit or certificate
22	issued under the authority of the United States or this state or its
23	instrumentality, even though the airplane, vessel or train, in the
24	

course of its travel, may cross an area in which the sale of
 alcoholic beverages by the individual drink is not authorized; and

2. To store alcoholic beverages in sealed containers of any
4 size at any airport, facility or station regularly served by the
5 licensee, in accordance with rules promulgated by the ABLE
6 Commission.

Alcoholic beverages purchased by the holder of an 7 в. airline/railroad license from the holder of a wholesaler license or 8 9 beer distributor license shall be presumed to be purchased for 10 consumption outside the State of Oklahoma or in interstate commerce, 11 and shall be exempt from the excise tax provided for in Section 104 12 of this act 5-101 of this title. A commercial vessel operating solely on the waterways within this state shall purchase alcoholic 13 beverages from the holder of a wholesaler license or beer 14 15 distributor license and shall not be exempt from the excise tax 16 provided in Section 5-101 of this title.

SECTION 2. AMENDATORY Section 31, Chapter 366, O.S.L. 2016 (37A O.S. Supp. 2018, Section 2-119), is amended to read as follows:

Section 2-119. An airline/railroad/commercial vessel beverage license may be issued to any corporation operating a commercial airline, vessel or railroad in or through this state. Application and payment of the license fee shall be made directly to the ABLE Commission.

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1 SECTION 3. AMENDATORY Section 50, Chapter 366, O.S.L.
2 2016 (37A O.S. Supp. 2018, Section 2-138), is amended to read as
3 follows:

Section 2-138. The holder of a mixed beverage, beer and wine, 4 5 caterer, special event, public event or airline/railroad/commercial vessel beverage license shall purchase alcoholic beverages only from 6 7 a licensed wine and spirits wholesaler or beer distributor, or as otherwise specifically provided by law; provided, the holder of a 8 9 mixed beverage, beer and wine, caterer or special event license 10 issued for an establishment which is also a restaurant may purchase 11 wine produced at small farm wineries or beer produced at small 12 breweries in this state directly from a winemaker or craft brewer as provided in Article XXVIIIA of the Oklahoma Constitution. 13

A wine and spirits wholesaler, beer distributor or a holder of a small brewer self-distribution license or brewpub self-distribution license may deliver such products to licensees authorized to sell alcoholic beverages for on-premises consumption; provided, such licensees may also pick up alcoholic beverage orders if they hold a private carrier license issued by the ABLE Commission.

SECTION 4. This act shall become effective July 1, 2019.
SECTION 5. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby

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1	declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
2	be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
