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SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 43A O.S. 2011, Section 10-103, as
 amended by Section 1, Chapter 39, O.S.L. 2016 (43A O.S. Supp. 2018,

mental or physical health and safety that the vulnerable adult is
unable to provide or obtain without assistance. The term
"protective services" includes but is not limited to services
provided to or obtained for such person in order to prevent or
remedy the abuse, neglect, or exploitation of such person;

13 2. "Services which are necessary to aid an individual to meet 14 essential requirements for mental or physical health and safety" 15 include, but shall not be limited to:

- a. the identification of vulnerable adults in need of the
  services,
- 18 b. the provision of medical care for physical and mental19 health needs,
- c. the provision of social services assistance in
   personal hygiene, food, clothing, and adequately
   heated and ventilated shelter,
- 23 d. protection from health and safety hazards,
- e. protection from physical mistreatment,

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- f. guardianship referral,
- g. outreach programs, and
- 3 h. the transportation necessary to secure any of such4 services.

5 The term shall not include taking the person into physical custody 6 without the consent of the person except as provided for in Sections 7 10-107 and 10-108 of this title, and the evaluation, monitoring, and 8 provision of protective placements;
