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1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

2 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
3 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 6-194.3 of Title 70, unless
4 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

5 A. The State Department of Education and the Department of
6 Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services, in consultation with
7 school district superintendents and school district boards of
8 education, shall develop and make available to school districts
9 information, training and resources to help school employees
10 recognize and address the mental health needs of students.

11 B. The information made available to school districts shall
12 include but not be limited to:

13 1. Information about the services provided by community-based
14 organizations related to mental health, substance abuse and trauma;

15 2. Information about the impact trauma and adverse childhood
16 experiences can have on a student's ability to learn;

17 3. The availability of mental health evaluation and treatment
18 available by telemedicine; and

19 4. Information about evidence-based strategies for prevention
20 of at-risk behaviors.

21 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 2019.

22 SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
23 of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby
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1 declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
2 be in full force from and after its passage and approval."

SECTION 5. This act shall become effective July 1, 2019.

SECTION 6. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
