PROPOSED COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE

An Act relating to the Child Abuse Prevention Act;
providing for dissemination of information related to
the termination of parental rights; requiring the
State Department of Health to provide birth record
information; requiring the Office of Child Abuse
Prevention to include certain statistics in annual
report; providing for review and assessment;
providing for codification; and providing an
effective date.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1-227.10 of Title 63, unless
there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

A. The Department of Human Services shall grant access to the
Office of Child Abuse Prevention to the identifying information of
individuals who have had their parental rights terminated and the
conditions which led to the making of the finding which resulted in
the termination of the rights of the parent pursuant to the
provisions of Section 1-4-502 of Title 10A of the Oklahoma Statutes.

1 B. The State Department of Health shall supply the Office of
2 Child Abuse Prevention with birth record information for a child
3 born to an individual whose identifying information has been
4 provided under subsection A of this section.

5 C. The Office of Child Abuse Prevention shall include these
6 statistics in the annual report outlined in Section 1-227.2 of Title
7 63 of the Oklahoma Statutes.

8 D. The Office of Child Abuse Prevention or other appropriate
9 division of the State Department of Health shall review the
10 information provided by the Department of Human Services and the
11 Division of Vital Records and, when appropriate and if the resources
12 are available, provide an assessment of the family and offer
13 services if needed.

14 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2019.

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
