20	Office of Child Abuse Prevention to the identifying information of
21	individuals who have had their parental rights terminated and the
22	conditions which led to the making of the finding which resulted in
23	the termination of the rights of the parent pursuant to the
24	provisions of Section 1-4-502 of Title 10A of the Oklahoma Statutes.

The State Department of Health shall supply the Office of 2 Child Abuse Prevention with birth record information for a child 3 born to an individual whose identifying information has been 4 provided under subsection A of this section. 5 C. The Office of Child Abuse Prevention shall include these statistics in the annual report outlined in Section 1-227.2 of Title 6 7 63 of the Oklahoma Statutes. 8 The Office of Child Abuse Prevention or other appropriate D. 9 division of the State Department of Health shall review the 10 information provided by the Department of Human Services and the 11 Division of Vital Records and, when appropriate and if the resources 12 are available, provide an assessment of the family and offer 13 services if needed. 14 SECTION 2.
