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18	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:			
19	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified			
20	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 27-110 of Title 70, unless there			
21	is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:			
22	A. This act shall be known and may be cited as the "Oklahoma			
23	Expanded Learning Act".			
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There is hereby created in the State Treasury a revolving fund for the State Board of Education to be designated the "Oklahoma Expanded Learning Revolving Fund". The fund shall be a continuing fund, not subject to fiscal year limitations, and shall consist of ten percent (10%) of the monies designated for common education and deposited in the General Revenue Fund from the tax on retail medical marijuana sales as provided for in Section 426 of Title 63 of the Oklahoma Statutes, federal funds, donations, grants, contributions and gifts from any public or private source. All monies accruing to the credit of the fund are hereby appropriated and may be budgeted and expended by the State Board of Education for the purposes of providing grants to create and support expanded learning programs as provided for in subsection C of this section. Expenditures from the fund shall be made upon warrants issued by the State Treasurer against claims filed as prescribed by law with the Director of the Office of Management and Enterprise Services for approval and payment.

C. Contingent upon the amount of funds available in the Oklahoma Expanded Learning Revolving Fund, the State Board of Education shall award one or more grants annually. The grants shall be used by school districts to create and support expanded learning programs. The programs shall:

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- 1. Assist students attending high-poverty, low-performing schools in meeting academic standards in core subjects by providing services to students and their families during out-of-school hours;
- 2. Implement highly effective, research-based programs to address academic needs;
- 3. Provide academic assistance along with enrichment opportunities to help students graduate college-, career- and citizen-ready; and
- 4. Support grant administration and professional development opportunities.
- D. The State Board of Education shall determine the criteria and establish a process for the submission of grant applications. The applications shall be considered on a statewide, competitive basis. The Board shall promulgate rules for the implementation of this act.
- SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2019.
