20	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
21	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
22	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 5019.1 of Title 74, unless there
23	is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
24	

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A. Effective July 1, 2020, the State Historic Preservation
 Office shall no longer be under the jurisdiction of the Oklahoma
 Historical Society and its duties and functions shall be transferred
 to the Oklahoma Department of Commerce.

B. All books, records, papers, equipment and tangible personal
property used by the State Historic Preservation Office shall be
transferred to the Oklahoma Department of Commerce.

8 C. Personnel assigned to the State Historic Preservation Office 9 shall be transferred to and become employees of the Oklahoma 10 Department of Commerce. All personnel transferred pursuant to the 11 provisions of this subsection shall be in the unclassified service 12 for purposes of the Oklahoma Personnel Act.

D. Any funds under the control of the State Historic
Preservation Office, with the exception of funds encumbered prior to
the effective date of this act, shall be transferred to the Oklahoma
Department of Commerce.

17 Ε. Any website information which identifies the State Historic 18 Preservation Office as an administrative unit of the Oklahoma 19 Historical Society shall be modified to reflect the transfer of 20 functions required by this act and, if necessary, the Oklahoma 21 Department of Commerce shall create a website or modify an existing 22 agency website so that the information contained in the existing 23 webpages for the State Historic Preservation Office will be 24 preserved to the extent possible and so that the Office is correctly

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identified as an administrative unit or program of the Oklahoma
 Department of Commerce.

3 SECTION 2. AMENDATORY 74 O.S. 2011, Section 840-5.5, as
4 last amended by Section 1, Chapter 365, O.S.L. 2019 (74 O.S. Supp.
5 2019, Section 840-5.5), is amended to read as follows:
6 Section 840-5.5 A. The following offices, positions, and

7 personnel shall be in the unclassified service and shall not be 8 placed under the classified service:

9 1. Persons chosen by popular vote or appointment to fill an 10 elective office, and their employees, except the employees of the 11 Corporation Commission, the State Department of Education and the 12 Department of Labor;

13 2. Members of boards and commissions, and heads of agencies; 14 also one principal assistant or deputy and one executive secretary 15 for each state agency;

3. All judges, elected or appointed, and their employees;
4. Persons employed with one-time, limited duration, federal or
other grant funding that is not continuing or indefinitely
renewable. The length of the unclassified employment shall not
exceed the period of time for which that specific federal funding is
provided;

5. All officers and employees of The Oklahoma State System of Higher Education, State Board of Education and Oklahoma Department of Career and Technology Education;

1 6. Persons employed in a professional or scientific capacity to 2 make or conduct a temporary and special inquiry, investigation, or examination on behalf of the Legislature or a committee thereof or 3 4 by authority of the Governor. These appointments and authorizations 5 shall terminate on the first day of the regular legislative session immediately following the appointment, if not terminated earlier. 6 7 However, nothing in this paragraph shall prevent the reauthorization and reappointment of any such person. Any such appointment shall be 8 9 funded from the budget of the appointing authority; 10 7. Election officials and employees;

11 8. Temporary employees employed to work less than one thousand 12 (1,000) hours in any twelve-month period, and seasonal employees 13 employed by the Oklahoma Tourism and Recreation Department pursuant 14 to Section 2241 of this title who work less than one thousand six 15 hundred (1,600) hours in any twelve-month period;

16 9. Department of Public Safety employees occupying the17 following offices or positions:

18 a. administrative aides to the Commissioner,

19 b. executive secretaries to the Commissioner,

c. the Governor's representative of the Oklahoma Highway
 Safety Office who shall be appointed by the Governor,

22 d. Highway Patrol Colonel,

23 e. Highway Patrol Lieutenant Colonel,

24 f. Highway Patrol Major,

4 10. Professional trainees only during the prescribed length of5 their course of training or extension study;

6 11. Students who are employed on a part-time basis, which shall 7 be seventy-five percent (75%) of a normal forty-hour work week or 8 thirty (30) hours per week, or less, or on a full-time basis if the 9 employment is pursuant to a cooperative education program such as 10 that provided for under Title I IV-D of the Higher Education Act of 11 1965 (20 U.S.C. 1087a-1087c), as amended, and who are regularly 12 enrolled in:

a. an institution of higher learning within The Oklahoma
State System of Higher Education,

15 an institution of higher learning qualified to become b. 16 coordinated with The Oklahoma State System of Higher 17 Education. For purposes of this section, a student 18 shall be considered a regularly enrolled student if 19 the student is enrolled in a minimum of five (5) hours 20 of accredited graduate courses or a minimum of ten 21 (10) hours of accredited undergraduate courses; 22 provided, however, the student shall only be required 23 to be enrolled in a minimum of six (6) hours of 24 accredited undergraduate courses during the summer, or

c. high school students regularly enrolled in a high
 school in Oklahoma and regularly attending classes
 during such time of enrollment;

4 12. The spouses of personnel who are employed on a part-time
5 basis to assist or work as a relief for their spouses in the
6 Oklahoma Tourism and Recreation Department;

7 13. Service substitute attendants who are needed to replace 8 museum and site attendants who are unavoidably absent. Service 9 substitutes may work as part-time or full-time relief for absentees 10 for a period of not more than four (4) weeks per year in the 11 Oklahoma Historical Society sites and museums; such substitutes will 12 not count towards the agency's full-time-equivalent (FTE) employee 13 limit;

14 14. Employees of the Oklahoma House of Representatives, the
15 State Senate, or the Legislative Service Bureau;

SECTION 4. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.

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
