17 SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 2 O.S. 2011, Section 10-	-9.7, as

20 Section 10-9.7 A. All poultry feeding operations sha	all utilize								
21 Best Management Practices and shall meet the conditions ar	nd

24 Oklahoma Registered Poultry Feeding Operations Act.									

1 The criteria for Best Management Practices shall be в. 2 promulgated by rules by the Board and shall include, but not be 3 limited to, the following: 4 There shall be no discharge of poultry waste to waters of 1. 5 the state; 6 2. Stored poultry waste shall be isolated from outside surface 7 drainage by covers, ditches, dikes, berms, terraces or other such structures; 8 9 3. No waters of the state shall come into direct contact with 10 the poultry confined on the poultry feeding operation; 11 4. Poultry waste handling, treatment, management, and removal 12 shall: 13 not create an environmental or a public health hazard, a. 14 not result in the contamination of waters of the b. 15 state, and 16 conform to such other handling, treatment and с. 17 management and removal requirements deemed necessary 18 by the Oklahoma Department of Agriculture, Food, and 19 Forestry to implement the Oklahoma Registered Poultry 20 Feeding Operations Act and rules promulgated pursuant 21 thereto. 22 The rules promulgated by the Board pursuant to this section 23 shall provide for exceptions to the storage requirements for poultry 24 waste in emergency situations. Such exceptions shall include but

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not be limited to allowing a contract poultry grower to take such actions as are necessary to meet requirements imposed on a grower by an integrator. In such situations growers shall be required to take all actions feasible to prevent pollution from stored poultry waste.

5 C. Every poultry feeding operation shall have a Nutrient6 Management Plan which shall include at a minimum:

7 1. A description of poultry waste handling procedures and
8 availability of equipment and type of equipment to be used;

9 2. The calculations and assumptions used for determining land-10 application rates if land application is applicable;

11 3. All nutrient analysis data, for soil and poultry waste 12 testing;

Legal description of lands to be used by an operation for
 land-application land application;

15 5. Land-application rates of poultry waste shall be based on 16 the available nitrogen and phosphorous content of the poultry waste 17 and shall provide controls for runoff and erosion as appropriate for 18 site conditions;

19 6. The procedures documented in the Nutrient Management Plan
20 shall ensure that the handling and utilization of poultry waste
21 complies with the following requirements:

a. adequate poultry waste storage shall be provided
 consistent with rules promulgated by the Oklahoma
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Department of Agriculture, Food, and Forestry pursuant to subsection B of this section,

- b. poultry waste shall not be applied to land when the
 ground is saturated or during rainfall events.
 Poultry waste shall not be applied to land when the
 ground is frozen except in conformance with the
 Nutrient Management Plan,
- 8 c. poultry waste shall only be applied to suitable land 9 at appropriate times and rates. Discharge or runoff 10 of waste from the application site is prohibited. 11 Timing and rate of applications shall be based on 12 assimilation capacity of the soil profile, assuming 13 usual nutrient losses, expected precipitation, and 14 soil conditions, and
- d. poultry waste application shall be prohibited on land
 subject to excessive erosion;

17 7. Records shall be maintained of all poultry wastes applied on 18 land owned or controlled by the operator, and sold or given to other 19 persons:

a. if the poultry waste is sold or given to other persons
for land application or other use, the poultry feeding
operation shall maintain a log of: date of removal
from the poultry feeding operation; name of recipient
the poultry waste is sold or given to; and amount in

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1 wet tons, dry tons or cubic yards of poultry waste 2 removed from the poultry feeding operation, and 3 b. the poultry feeding operation shall make available to 4 the recipient any nutrient sample analysis from that 5 year;

8. Any analysis required by the provisions of the Oklahoma
Registered Poultry Feeding Operations Act or rules promulgated
thereto shall be performed by a qualified environmental testing
laboratory certified by the Department of Environmental Quality and
approved by the Oklahoma Department of Agriculture, Food, and
Forestry; and

9. Such other information deemed necessary by the Oklahoma
 Department of Agriculture, Food, and Forestry to administer the
 provisions of the Oklahoma Registered Poultry Feeding Operations Act
 and rules promulgated pursuant thereto.

16 D. The original Nutrient Management Plans submitted after the 17 effective date of this act shall be prepared by the producer or 18 designee of the producer. After the plan is submitted to the 19 Oklahoma Department of Agriculture, Food, and Forestry may 20 promulgate rules providing voluntary fees charged to registered for 21 review and approval and the Department determines that a submitted 22 plan needs or requires any corrections or modifications, the 23 Department shall return an original plan to the producer for needed 24 corrections. However, if the Department determines a renewal plan

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1 needs or requires corrections or modification, the Department shall 2 make any and all needed corrections to approve the plan and notify 3 the poultry feeding operations for the development and writing of 4 Nutrient Management Plans; operation of the modifications and 5 approve the plan. 6 Except as otherwise provided in this subsection, a Nutrient Ε. 7 Management Plan for every poultry feeding operation shall be renewed 8 and an updated plan shall be submitted to the Oklahoma Department of 9 Agriculture, Food, and Forestry every six (6) years from the date 10 the initial or previous plan was submitted. The producer shall have 11 the option to submit the renewed or updated plan through the 12 Department's website or a printable online form designed by the 13 Department. However, a current poultry operator may submit a one-14 page amendment to the most recently submitted plan in lieu of a 15 renewal plan through the Department's website. Poultry feeding 16 operations submitting an amendment pursuant to this subsection shall 17 still be subject to the soil and poultry waste testing requirements 18 under subsections F and G of this section. The amendment shall 19 contain the following statements: 20 1. No changes in the waste utilization standards have occurred 21 since the most recently submitted Nutrient Management Plan; 22 2. There has been no change to the number of poultry housed 23 since the most recently submitted Nutrient Management Plan;

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1	3. There has been no expansion in the poultry feeding operation						
2	since the most recently submitted Nutrient Management Plan; and						
3	4. The entirety of the poultry waste is:						
4	a. removed off site as provided in the poultry feeding						
5	operation's annual report, as required by subsection J						
6	of this section, and will continue to be removed off						
7	site for the next six (6) years, or						
8	b. land-applied and will continue to be land-applied for						
9	the next six (6) years.						
10	<u>F.</u> Every poultry feeding operation located in a non-nutrient-						
11	limited watershed and non-nutrient-vulnerable groundwaters shall						
12	perform soil testing on each land-application area and poultry waste						
13	testing at least once every three (3) years to determine:						
14	1. Soil pH and plant-available nutrients including, at a						
15	minimum, nitrogen, phosphorous and potassium;						
16	2. Poultry waste nutrient concentrations and moisture; and						
17	3. Application rate based upon current United States Department						
18	of Agriculture Natural Resources Conservation Service Waste						
19	Utilization Standards, unless the Oklahoma Department of						
20	Agriculture, Food, and Forestry approves other standards.						
21	F. G. Every poultry feeding operation located in a nutrient-						
22	limited watershed and nutrient-vulnerable groundwater shall perform						
23	an annual soil test on each land-application area prior to the first						
24	application of the calendar year. Poultry waste testing shall be						

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1 performed annually prior to the first application of the calendar 2 year. Soil and poultry waste testing shall be performed to 3 determine:

4 1. Soil pH and plant-available nutrients including at least
5 nitrogen, phosphorous and potassium;

6 2. Poultry waste nutrient concentrations and moisture; and
7 3. Application rate based upon current United States Department
8 of Agriculture Natural Resources Conservation Service Waste
9 Utilization Standards, unless the Oklahoma Department of
10 Agriculture, Food, and Forestry approves other standards.

11 G. H. 1. Soil and poultry waste analysis data shall be 12 retained by the poultry feeding operation for a minimum of six (6) 13 years.

All soil and poultry waste analysis data shall be dated
 prior to land application.

16 H. I. Poultry feeding operations shall develop a plan for 17 the disposal of carcasses associated with normal mortality.

18 2. In the event there is an outbreak of a major disease or 19 other emergency resulting in deaths significantly higher than normal 20 mortality rates, the Oklahoma Department of Agriculture, Food, and 21 Forestry may approve, in writing, an alternate method of disposal of 22 carcasses or the storage of poultry waste during the emergency 23 period.

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I. J. Every poultry feeding operation shall file by September 1 1 2 of each year an annual report with the Department regarding all poultry waste removed from or land-applied by the facility for the 3 period from July 1 of the previous year through June 30 of that 4 5 year. The report shall contain the following information: 6 The date and amount of poultry waste removed from or land-1. 7 applied at the facility; 2. The type of poultry waste removed or land-applied, whether a 8 9 cake out, full clean out, in-house windrow or compost, poultry waste 10 stack shed, or other type; 11 The county and, if applicable, the name of the Nutrient 3. 12 Limited Watershed where the poultry waste was produced; and 13 4. The location where the poultry waste is removed to: 14 if land-applied on site, provide the following: a. 15 (1)the date of the land-application land 16 application, 17 (2)the total amount of poultry waste land-applied in 18 wet tons, dry tons, or cubic yards, 19 (3) the name, mailing address, and telephone number 20 of the poultry waste applicator, and 21 (4) the number of acres under the control of the 22 poultry feeding operation for land-application 23 land application of poultry waste, or 24 b. if removed off site, provide the following:

1	(1)	the	date	of	the	removal	off	site,

- 2 (2) the amount of poultry waste removed in wet tons,
 3 dry tons, or cubic yards,
- 4 (3) the name, mailing address, and telephone number
 5 of the person the poultry waste is sold or
 6 transferred to,
- 7 (4) the name, mailing address, telephone number, and
 8 poultry waste applicator license number of the
 9 poultry waste applicator, if known, and
- 10 (5) the name, mailing address, and telephone number
 11 of the hauler of the poultry waste.

SECTION 2. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.

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
