The Department shall review the handbook and make revisions, 4 as necessary, on an annual basis with stakeholders, including, but 5 not limited to, previous members of the Dyslexia and Education Task Force and the Oklahoma Advisory Panel created pursuant to Part B of 6 7 the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act. Previous members of the Task Force may be consulted when making revisions to the 8 9 handbook. Members of the Task Force not available for the annual 10 review may be replaced by individuals meeting the criteria of his or her original appointment in order to maintain the original 11 12 composition of the Task Force.

13 C. Any revisions to the handbook shall include, but not be 14 limited to, the following information for local school systems 15 screening students in kindergarten and grades one through three who 16 have been identified through the response-to-intervention process as 17 having characteristics of dyslexia:

18 Evidence-based practices designed specifically for students 1. 19 with characteristics of dyslexia;

2. Characteristics of targeted instruction for dyslexia; 21 3. Guidance on developing instructional plans for students with 22 characteristics of dyslexia;
