PROPOSED SUBCOMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE

An Act relating to the Department of Public Safety;  
requiring mileage reimbursement for certain  
employees; prescribing method for reimbursement using  
standard utilized by Internal Revenue Service for  
purposes of federal income taxation; providing for  
inapplicability to certain employees; providing for  
alternative option based on state-owned vehicles;  
providing for codification; and declaring an  
emergency.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified  
in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 2-107.1A of Title 47, unless  
there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

A. Except as otherwise provided by this section, the Department  
of Public Safety shall provide travel reimbursement to any of its  
employees who are dispatchers as of the effective date of this act  
whose primary job location is modified as a result of consolidation  
of dispatch locations or centers made by the Department after

1 January 1, 2020. The reimbursement shall be equal to the mileage  
2 allowance published by the Internal Revenue Service for purposes of  
3 deductible mileage reimbursement for purposes of federal income tax  
4 returns for each calendar year. The reimbursement shall be for the  
5 additional miles traveled both to and from the new job location  
6 compared to the number of miles traveled to and from work by the  
7 employee using the prior job location and shall continue to be paid  
8 for any period of time that the dispatcher is required to use a  
9 personal vehicle in order to travel to or from the new job location.  
10 The provisions of this section shall not be applicable to a  
11 dispatcher whose first employment with the Department of Public  
12 Safety begins on or after the effective date of this act.

13 B. The Department of Public Safety shall have the option of  
14 providing a state-owned vehicle to the employees described in  
15 subsection A of this section as an alternative to the requirement  
16 for travel reimbursement.

17 SECTION 2. It being immediately necessary for the preservation  
18 of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby  
19 declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and  
20 be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
