from such recording.

- C. It shall be unlawful for a law enforcement officer, with the intent to obstruct justice, to fail to turn on, to disable, to turn off or operate audio or video recording equipment in any manner that prevents the creation of evidence. Any law enforcement officer who violates the provisions of this subsection shall, upon conviction, be guilty of a misdemeanor.
- D. As used in this section, "audio or video recording equipment" means an electronic recording device that is capable of recording audio and video.

SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2020.
