8	An Act relating to the Corporation Commission;
9	creating the Task Force on Injection Well Stability; specifying membership of Task Force; establishing

11	support staff; authorizing Task Force to issue reports and recommendations; establishing sunset date
12	for Task Force; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.
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15	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
16	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
17	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 526 of Title 17, unless there is
18	created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
19	A. There is hereby created the "Task Force on Injection Well
20	Stability".
21	B. The Task Force shall be composed of members as follows:
22	1. A Corporation Commissioner or designee, to serve as chair;
23	2. The Secretary of Energy and Environment or designee;
24	3. The Secretary of Agriculture or designee;

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1 4. A representative from the Department of Environmental 2 Quality;

- 5. A representative from the Oklahoma Water Resources Board;
- 6. A representative from the Oklahoma Conservation Commission;
- 7. A representative from a relevant trade association operating in this state, to be selected by the Corporation Commission;
- 8. Two representatives from a statewide organization representing oil and gas development in this state, to be selected by the Corporation Commission; and
- 9. Up to two other members as the Corporation Commission deems necessary.
- C. A majority of the members serving on the Task Force shall constitute a quorum. The Task Force shall meet at such times and places as it deems necessary to perform its duties as specified herein. Meetings shall be at the call of the chair.
- D. Members of the Task Force shall not be reimbursed for travel expenses incurred while serving on the Task Force.
- E. The Corporation Commission shall provide such staff support as is required by the Task Force and any other state agency shall provide support as requested by the Task Force.
- F. The Task Force may issue any reports it deems necessary and appropriate and may make any legislative recommendations available to the Governor and the Legislature. The Legislature shall review any reports or recommendations developed by the Task Force. Final

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    authority relating to the implementation of any recommended
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    statutory revisions shall reside with the Legislature.
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        G.
            The Task Force shall remain in effect and operate as herein
    directed until its termination which shall be no later than December
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    1, 2023. The Task Force may elect, by majority vote, to terminate
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    its operations at an earlier date if it deems such action
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    appropriate.
        SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2020.
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
