Supp. 2018, Section 353.1a), which relates to prescribing authority; transferring certain authority 10 to the Committee of the Joint Boards of Nursing and 11 Medicine; modifying requirements for prescribing authority of certain Advanced Practice Registered 12 Nurses; updating terms; providing certain limitation; creating the Committee of the Joint Boards of Nursing and Medicine; providing for membership; stating 13 purpose of Committee; providing for certain advisory committee; directing promulgation of rules; requiring 14 certain malpractice insurance; providing for codification; and providing an effective date. 15 16 17 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA: 18 SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 59 O.S. 2011, Section 353.1a, as 19 amended by Section 2, Chapter 106, O.S.L. 2018 (59 O.S. Supp. 2018, 20 Section 353.1a), is amended to read as follows: 21 Section 353.1a. A. Prescribing authority shall be allowed, 22 under the medical direction of a supervising physician, for an 23 advanced practice nurse Advanced Practice Registered Nurse 24

recognized by the Oklahoma Board of Nursing Committee of the Joint Board of Nursing and Medicine in one of the following categories: advanced registered nurse practitioners, clinical nurse specialists, or certified nurse-midwives Certified Nurse Practitioners, Clinical Nurse Specialists and Certified Nurse-Midwives; provided, however, prescribing authority shall be allowed without the medical direction of a supervising physician for a Certified Nurse Practitioner or Clinical Nurse Specialist who: 

1. Has at least seven (7) years of experience as a Certified

Nurse Practitioner or Clinical Nurse Specialist; and

2. After completing such seven (7) years of supervised practice, has practiced for not less than three (3) years in a medically underserved area (MUA) as determined by the Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA). The advanced practice nurse Advanced Practice Registered Nurse may write or sign, or transmit by word of mouth, telephone or other means of communication an order for drugs or medical supplies that is intended to be filled, compounded, or dispensed by a pharmacist. The supervising physician, if applicable, and the advanced practice nurse Advanced Practice Registered Nurse shall be identified at the time of origination of the prescription and the name of the advanced practice nurse Advanced Practice Registered Nurse shall be printed on the prescription label.

B. Pharmacists may dispense prescriptions for non-controlled prescription drugs authorized by an advanced practice nurse Advanced Practice Registered Nurse or physician assistant, not located in Oklahoma, provided that they are the Advanced Practice Registered Nurse is licensed in the state in which they are the Advanced Practice Registered Practice Registered Nurse is actively prescribing.

- C. Pharmacists may only dispense prescriptions for controlled dangerous substances prescribed by an advanced practice nurse or:
- 1. A physician assistant licensed <u>and located</u> in the State of Oklahoma and supervised by an Oklahoma-licensed practitioner; or
- 2. An Advanced Practice Registered Nurse licensed and located in the state of Oklahoma who is:
  - a. supervised by an Oklahoma licensed practitioner, or
  - <u>b.</u> <u>exempt from supervision pursuant to the provisions of</u> subsection A of this section.
- SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 567.4c of Title 59, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
- A. There is hereby created the Committee of the Joint Boards of Nursing and Medicine. The Executive Directors of the Oklahoma Board of Nursing and the State Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision shall each appoint three members from their boards to the Committee of the Joint Boards of Nursing and Medicine. At least one of the appointees from the Board of Nursing shall be a licensed Advanced

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Practice Registered Nurse. The purpose of the Committee shall be to
license Advanced Practice Registered Nurses and oversee the practice
of Advanced Practice Registered Nurses, including prescriptive
authority.
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- B. The Committee, in its discretion, may appoint an advisory committee. Such advisory committee shall be comprised of four licensed physicians and four licensed Advanced Practice Registered Nurses. Appointment to the advisory committee shall be for four (4) years; members may be appointed for one additional four-year period.
- C. The Committee shall promulgate such rules as are necessary to implement the provisions of this act.
- SECTION 3. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 567.27 of Title 59, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
  - Either an Advanced Practice Registered Nurse or his or her employer shall be required to carry not less than One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00) of malpractice insurance with an aggregate of not less than Three Million Dollars (\$3,000,000.00).
- SECTION 4. This act shall become effective November 1, 2019.

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
