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15	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:		
16	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 63 O.S. 2011, Section 142.6, as		
17	last amended by Section 2, Chapter 148, O.S.L. 2019 (63 O.S. Supp.		
18	2019, Section 142.6), is amended to read as follows:		
19	Section 142.6 A. Before an excavator shall demolish a		
20	structure, discharge any explosive or commence to excavate in a		
21	highway, street, alley or other public ground or way, on or near the		
22	location of an operator's underground facilities, or a private		
23	easement, such excavator shall first notify all operators in the		
24	geographic area defined by the notification center who have on file		

1 with the notification center a notice pursuant to Section 142.3 of 2 this title to determine whether any operators have underground 3 facilities in or near the proposed area of excavation or demolition. 4 When an excavator has knowledge that an operator does not have 5 underground facilities within the area of the proposed excavation, the excavator need not notify the operator of the proposed 6 7 excavation. However, an excavator shall be responsible for damage to the underground facilities of an operator if the notification 8 9 center was not notified. Notice shall be given no more than ten 10 (10) days nor less than forty-eight (48) hours, excluding the date 11 of notification, Saturdays, Sundays and legal holidays, prior to the 12 commencement of the excavation or demolition.

13 Each operator served with notice in accordance with в. 14 subsection A of this section either directly or by notice to the 15 notification center shall, prior to the date and time work is 16 scheduled to begin, unless otherwise agreed to between the excavator 17 and operator, locate and mark or otherwise provide the approximate 18 location of the underground facilities of the operator in a manner 19 as to enable the excavator to employ hand-dug test holes to 20 determine the precise location of the underground facilities in 21 advance of excavation. For the purpose of this act, the approximate 22 location of the underground facilities shall be defined as a strip 23 of land two (2) feet on either side of such underground facilities. 24 Whenever an operator is served with notice of an excavation or

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demolition and determines that the operator does not have underground facilities located within the proposed area of excavation or demolition, the operator shall communicate this information to the excavator originating the notice prior to the commencement of such excavation or demolition.

6 The only exception to subsection A of this section shall be С. 7 when an emergency exists that endangers life, health or property. Under these conditions, excavation operations may begin immediately, 8 9 providing provided reasonable precautions are taken to protect 10 underground facilities. All operators of underground facilities 11 within the area of the emergency must be notified promptly when an 12 emergency requires excavation prior to the location of the 13 underground facilities being marked.

D. Every notice given by an excavator to an operator pursuant to this section or to the notification center pursuant to Section 142.3 of this title shall contain at least the following 17 information:

18 1. The name of the individual serving such notice;

19 2. The location of the proposed area of excavation or 20 demolition;

21 3. The name, address and telephone number of the excavator or 22 excavator's company;

4. The excavator's field telephone number, if one is available;

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1	5. The type and the extent of the proposed work, not to exceed			
2	five hundred (500) linear feet in incorporated areas or one (1)			
3	linear mile in unincorporated areas;			
4	6. Whether or not the discharging of explosives is anticipated;			
5	and			
6	7. The date and time when work is to begin.			
7	E. In marking the approximate location of underground			
8	facilities, an operator shall follow the standard color coding			
9	described herein:
