10	An Act relating to student records; amending 70 O.S. 2011, Section 3-160, which relates to development of
11	a state student record system; updating references; authorizing the State Department of Education to
12	define requirements for submission of certain data elements in compliance with certain framework for
13	certain systems; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.
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16	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
17	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 70 O.S. 2011, Section 3-160, is
18	amended to read as follows:
19	Section 3-160. A. In developing and implementing a state
20	student record system, as required in Subsection E of Section 18-
21	200.1 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes this title, and as needed
22	to comply with the tracking and reporting requirements of the
23	Elementary and Secondary Education Act of $\frac{2001}{1965}$ (ESEA), P.L. No.
24	107-110 114-95, also known as the "No Child Left Behind Act of 2001"

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1 <u>as reauthorized by the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA) of 2015</u>, 2 the State Department of Education shall construct the system to 3 contain the following elements and comply with the following 4 standards and compliance capabilities:

5 1. Extensible Markup Language (XML), which defines common data
6 formats used during communication between disparate systems;

7 2. Web services protocol developed by the World Wide Web
8 Consortium, which enables systems that are physically separated but
9 connected to the Internet to be combined to permit complex
10 operations;

3. Schools Interoperability Framework (SIF) version 1.5 specifications, or any updated versions of the specifications, which enable school district software management systems to communicate with each other. The student record system shall include, but not be limited to, the specifications for course identifiers, state standard formatting, content formatting, and assessment formatting specification;

United States Department of Education Performance-Based Data
 Management Initiative (PBDMI) EDFacts data exchange guidelines with
 data elements capable of providing reporting on federal educational
 programs; and

5. Defined state data codes to ensure consistent reporting from school districts including, but not limited to, data codes for course identifiers, entries, gains, and losses. Current data codes

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for teacher certification and the Oklahoma Cost Accounting System
 shall be extended to match other defined data codes.

B. By the 2005-2006 school year, any Any student information
system and any instructional management system used by school
districts in the state shall comply with the Extensible Markup
Language (XML) standards and the Schools Interoperability Framework
(SIF) version 1.5 specifications, or any updated versions of the
specifications.

9 <u>C. The State Department of Education shall have the authority</u>
10 <u>to define requirements for the submission of data elements in</u>
11 <u>compliance with the Schools Interoperability Framework (SIF) version</u>
12 <u>1.5 for the student information systems and instructional management</u>
13 <u>systems used by school districts statewide in compliance with state</u>
14 <u>and federal statutes.</u>
15 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 2019.

SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.

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
