8	An Act relating to the school calendar; amending 70 O.S. 2011, Section 1-109, as last amended by Section
9	1, Chapter 6, O.S.L. 2016 (70 O.S. Supp. 2018, Section 1-109), which relates to the length of the
10	school year; allowing school districts to adopt certain school-hours policy beginning with certain
11	school year if certain requirement is met; allowing school districts to retain certain school-hours
12	policy beginning with certain school year if certain requirement is met and certain report is submitted;
13	amending 70 O.S. 2011, Section 4516, which relates to a continuous school program; adding certain statutory
14	reference; updating statutory references; and providing an effective date.

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17	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
18	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 70 O.S. 2011, Section 1-109, as
19	last amended by Section 1, Chapter 6, O.S.L. 2016 (70 O.S. Supp.
20	2018, Section 1-109), is amended to read as follows:
21	Section 1-109. A. For all public schools in Oklahoma, school
22	shall actually be in session and classroom instruction offered:
23	1. For not less than one hundred eighty (180) days; or
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2. For not less than one thousand eighty (1,080) hours each
 2 school year, if a district board of education adopts a school-hours
 3 policy and, notifies the State Board of Education prior to October
 4 15 of the applicable school year and meets the requirements of
 5 subsection H of this section.

B. A school district may not count more than thirty (30) hours
each school year that are used for attendance of professional
meetings toward the one hundred eighty (180) days or one thousand
eighty (1,080) hours of classroom instruction time required in
subsection A of this section.

C. Teachers off contract with an employing district shall not 11 12 be required by the employing school district to attend professional meetings unless the teacher is paid additional compensation for the 13 additional time. Teachers may be paid additional compensation for 14 15 attending professional meetings in excess of their contract term. Subject to district board of education policy or collective 16 bargaining agreement, additional paid professional days may be 17 granted for individual teachers to attend or participate in 18 professional meetings, staff development training, or National Board 19 certification portfolio development as provided for in Section 6-20 204.2 of this title. 21

D. A school district may authorize parent-teacher conferences to be held during a regular school day. If authorized by the school district, parent-teacher conferences shall be counted as classroom

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1 instruction time for no more than six (6) hours per semester, for a
2 total of twelve (12) hours per school year.

E. A school district may maintain school for less than a full school year only when conditions beyond the control of school authorities make the maintenance of the term impossible and the State Board of Education has been apprised and has expressed concurrence in writing.

8 F. The State Board of Education shall establish criteria for an 9 extended-day schedule for schools subject to paragraph 1 of 10 subsection A of this section. The criteria shall:

Prescribe a lengthened school day within limits determined
 not to be detrimental to quality instruction;

Ensure that the schedule is equivalent in annual hours of
 instruction to the one-hundred-eighty-day school year specified in
 paragraph 1 of subsection A of this section; and

3. Be consistent with the provisions of this section and
Sections 1-111 and 1-112 of this title, but may result in fewer
annual days of instruction.

19 G. Notwithstanding the provisions of subsection F of this 20 section, a school district board of education subject to paragraph 1 21 of subsection A of this section may adopt and implement an extended-22 day schedule subject to the following requirements:

The annual number of hours of instruction shall equal or
 exceed one thousand eighty (1,080) hours, which is the equivalent of

1 one hundred eighty (180) days of instruction as specified in 2 subsection A of this section for six (6) hours each day as specified 3 in Section 1-111 of this title;

2. The annual number of days of instruction shall equal or
5 exceed one hundred eighty (180) days as specified in subsection A of
6 this section;

7 3. The schedule adopted shall be consistent with the provisions
8 of Sections 1-111 and 1-112 of this title, except that for not more
9 than one (1) day per week, a school day shall consist of not less
10 than five (5) hours devoted to academic instruction in a regular
11 classroom setting;

12 4. The district shall hold a public hearing prior to the 13 adoption of an extended-day schedule authorized pursuant to this 14 subsection; and

The district shall document the impact on student 15 5. achievement as determined by the academic performance data score and 16 any other relevant factors that are a result of implementation of an 17 extended-day schedule authorized pursuant to this subsection and 18 provide an annual report to the State Board of Education of the 19 results. If improvement in student achievement cannot be documented 20 in the report, the district board of education shall revoke 21 authorization as provided by this subsection. If the district does 22 not revoke authorization after student achievement is not documented 23

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in the report, the State Board of Education may deny accreditation
 of any school in violation of this subsection.

3 1. Beginning with the 2020-2021 school year, a school Η. 4 district board of education may adopt a school-hours policy as 5 provided for by paragraph 2 of subsection A of this section only if the average performance of students in the school district met or 6 7 exceeded the statewide average performance of students on each assessment administered pursuant to Section 1210.508 of this title 8 9 during the previous school year. 10 2. Beginning with the 2021-2022 school year, a school district 11 that has adopted a school-hours policy as provided for by paragraph 12 2 of subsection A of this section may retain the policy only if the school district meets the requirement of paragraph 1 of this 13 subsection and the school district provides evidence that adoption 14 15 of the four-day school week yielded cost savings during the prior school year. The evidence of cost savings shall be submitted in a 16 report to the State Board of Education at the same time notification 17 is made as required by paragraph 2 of subsection A of this section. 18 I. If subject to paragraph 2 of subsection A of this section, a 19 district board of education or designee may elect to close a school 20 during the school day for inclement weather purposes. In such an 21 event, the number of hours incurred in classroom instruction time 22 prior to school closure shall be counted toward the one thousand 23

24 eighty (1,080) hours per year requirement.

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1 I. J. Nothing in this section shall be construed as affecting 2 the right of an employing school district to require teachers as defined in Section 6-101.3 of this title to work in excess of the 3 one thousand eighty (1,080) hours required for student instruction. 4 5 In addition, nothing in this section shall be construed to affect the Fair Labor Standards Act status of any school district employee. 6 SECTION 2. 70 O.S. 2011, Section 4516, is 7 AMENDATORY amended to read as follows: 8

9 Section 4516. The board of education of any school district
10 operating pursuant to the provisions of this act Section 4511 et
11 seq. of this title shall establish a school calendar whereby the
12 teaching sessions and vacation periods during the school year are on
13 a rotating basis.

Each selected school shall be closed for all students and employees on regular school holidays.

16 The schools and classes shall be conducted for a total of no 17 less than one hundred eighty (180) days or no less than one thousand 18 eighty (1,080) hours during the academic year <u>as provided for in</u> 19 Section 1-109 of this title.

The provisions of all other laws relating to compulsory fulltime education and the enrollment and attendance of pupils in the kindergarten, elementary and secondary grades shall be applicable with respect to the regular school days prescribed for the entire academic year established for the school at which a program pursuant

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1	to <del>this act</del> <u>Section 4511 et seq. of this title</u> is conducted, and to
2	the attendance area established for such school.
3	SECTION 3. This act shall become effective July 1, 2020.
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
