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15	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
16	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law not to be
17	codified in the Oklahoma Statutes reads as follows:
18	This act shall be known and may be cited as the "Medical Care
19	Provider Protection Act".
20	SECTION 2. AMENDATORY 21 O.S. 2011, Section 650.4, is
21	amended to read as follows:
22	Section 650.4. A. Every person who, without justifiable or
23	excusable cause and with intent to do bodily harm, commits any
24	assault, battery or assault and battery upon the person of <del>an</del>

1 emergency a medical care provider who is performing medical care 2 duties, upon conviction, is guilty of a felony punishable by 3 imprisonment in the custody of the Department of Corrections for a term not exceeding two (2) years, or by a fine not exceeding One 4 5 Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00), or by both such fine and imprisonment. B. As used in this section, "emergency medical care provider" 6 means doctors, residents, interns, nurses, nurses' aides, ambulance 7 attendants and operators, paramedics, emergency medical technicians, 8 9 laboratory technicians, radiologic technologists, physical 10 therapists, physician assistants, chaplains, volunteers, 11 pharmacists, nursing students, medical students and members of a 12 hospital security force. SECTION 3. 21 O.S. 2011, Section 650.5, is 13 AMENDATORY amended to read as follows: 14 Section 650.5. A. Every person who, without justifiable or 15 excusable cause and with intent to do bodily harm, commits any 16 aggravated assault and battery or any assault with a firearm or 17 other deadly weapon upon the person of an emergency medical 18 technician or other emergency a medical care provider, upon 19 conviction, is guilty of a felony punishable by imprisonment in a 20 state correctional institution the custody of the Department of 21 Corrections for a term not less than two (2) years nor more than one 22 (1) year five (5) years, or by a fine not to exceed One Thousand 23 Dollars (\$1,000.00), or by both such fine and imprisonment. 24

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1 B. As used in this section, "medical care provider" means 2 doctors, residents, interns, nurses, nurses' aides, ambulance 3 attendants and operators, paramedics, emergency medical technicians, 4 laboratory technicians, radiologic technologists, physical 5 therapists, physician assistants, chaplains, volunteers, pharmacists, nursing students, medical students and members of a 6 7 hospital security force. SECTION 4. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified 8 9 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1-114.3 of Title 63, unless 10 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows: 11 A. Every hospital, health clinic and ambulance service shall display at all times in a prominent place a printed sign with a 12 13 minimum height of twenty (20) inches and a minimum width of fourteen (14) inches, with each letter to be a minimum of one-fourth (1/4)14 inch in height, which shall read as follows: 15 WARNING: ASSAULTING A MEDICAL PROFESSIONAL WHO IS ENGAGED IN THE 16 17 PERFORMANCE OF HIS OR HER OFFICIAL DUTIES IS A SERIOUS CRIME. Section 650.4 of Title 21 of the Oklahoma Statutes. 18 B. Every hospital, health clinic and ambulance service shall 19 report all assaults on medical care providers to the State 20 Department of Health on an annual basis. The State Department of 21 Health shall have rulemaking authority to implement the provisions 22 of this section. 23

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1	C. The Department of Health shall not make public any
2	identifiable information in regard to facility, individual or
3	location of assaults.
