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12	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
13	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 26 O.S. 2011, Section 1-105, as
14	amended by Section 1, Chapter 69, O.S.L. 2014 (26 O.S. Supp. 2018,
15	Section 1-105), is amended to read as follows:
16	Section 1-105. A. In the event of the death of a political
17	party's nominee for office prior to the date of the General
18	Election, or in the event that a deceased person receives a
19	political party's nomination for office, a substitute candidate will
20	be permitted to have his or her name placed on the General Election
21	ballot as follows:
22	1. If the nominee was a candidate for county office, the
23	political party's central committee of the county shall notify the
24	secretary of the county election board of the name of an alternative

1 candidate to be placed on the General Election ballot. Such notice 2 shall be submitted in writing, within fifteen (15) days after the 3 death has occurred, but not later than five o'clock p.m. on the Friday following the date of the Runoff Primary Election, and shall 4 5 be signed by at least two duly authorized members of the political party's county central committee. If a political party's central 6 committee fails to submit the notice in the manner described, then a 7 nominee for that party shall not appear on the ballot for that 8 9 office;

10 2. If the nominee was a candidate who filed a Declaration of 11 Candidacy with the State Election Board, the state central committee 12 of the party affected shall notify the Secretary of the State Election Board of the name of an alternative candidate to be placed 13 on the General Election ballot. Such notice shall be submitted in 14 writing, within fifteen (15) days after the death has occurred, but 15 not later than five o'clock p.m. on the Friday following the date of 16 the Runoff Primary Election, and shall be signed by at least two 17 duly authorized members of the political party's state central 18 committee. If a political party's central committee fails to submit 19 the notice in the manner described, then a nominee for that party 20 shall not appear on the ballot for that office; and 21

3. Provided, if the death of a political party's nominee for
an office described in paragraph 1 or 2 of this subsection should
occur after the Friday following the date of the Runoff Primary

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Election, then the election shall proceed with the deceased
 candidate's name printed on the ballot.

B. In the event of the death of an independent candidate for an
office described in paragraph 1 or 2 of subsection A of this
section, the following procedure shall apply:

If the death occurs on or prior to the Friday following the
date of the Runoff Primary Election, the candidate's name shall not
be printed on the ballot; and

9 2. If the death occurs after the Friday following the date of 10 the Runoff Primary Election, the candidate's name shall be printed 11 on the ballot.

12 C. In the event a deceased candidate is certified by the 13 appropriate Election Board as having won an election, a vacancy in 14 the office shall occur upon the date the candidate would have taken 15 office, and the vacancy shall be filled in the manner prescribed by 16 law.

D. In the event of the death of a candidate who was unopposed
for election, a Special Election shall be called by the Governor.
The Special Election shall be conducted according to the laws
governing such elections, Section 12-101 et seq. of this title.
SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2019.
