7	licensure; amending Section 1, Chapter 226, O.S.L. 2012, and Section 8, Chapter 226, O.S.L. 2012 (59
8	O.S. Supp. 2018, Sections 4100 and 4100.7), which relate to the Post-Military Service Occupation,
9	Education and Credentialing Act; changing name of act; modifying reference; allowing submission of
10	advance license application for certain military persons; directing acceptance of licenses and
11	certifications from other states for certain military persons; requiring issuance of certain licenses and
12	certifications within certain time; stating period of licensure; requiring notice of denial of application;
13	providing for temporary credential under certain condition; providing certain right of appeal; allowing right to obtain and submit documentation for
14	licensure; directing waiver of fees for certain military persons; excepting licensure for certain
15	persons under certain military base regulations; directing promulgation of rules; providing for
16	codification; and providing an effective date.
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19	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
20	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY Section 1, Chapter 226, O.S.L.
21	2012 (59 O.S. Supp. 2018, Section 4100), is amended to read as
22	follows:
23	Section 4100. This act shall be known and may be cited as the
24	"Post-Military Service Occupation, Education and Credentialing Act"

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SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 4100.8 of Title 59, unless there
is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

Every active duty military personnel and their spouse who is 4 Α. 5 licensed or certified in any occupation or profession in another state, upon receiving notice or orders for military transfer or 6 honorable discharge to this state, may in advance of actual transfer 7 or discharge submit a completed application to the appropriate 8 9 licensing or credentialing agency in this state to request an 10 expedited temporary, reciprocal or comity license or certification for their currently held valid license or certification from another 11 12 state or territory of the United States so such person may upon entering this state be authorized to continue their licensed or 13 certified occupation or profession without delay. 14

B. Every administrative body, state agency director or official 15 with authority over any occupational or professional license or 16 17 certification, and each of the respective examining and licensing boards, agencies and commissions in this state, shall, upon receipt 18 of an active duty military application submitted as authorized in 19 subsection A of this section, and presentation of satisfactory 20 evidence of equivalent education, training and experience on such 21 valid license or certification from another state, accept the valid 22 license or certification and apply all its education, training and 23 experience in the manner most favorable toward satisfying the 24

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qualifications for issuance of the requested license or certification in this state, and shall issue the requested Oklahoma license or certification within thirty (30) days provided the license or certification from the other state is found to be in good standing and reasonably equivalent to the requirements of this state.

7 С. The temporary, reciprocal or comity license or certification issued pursuant to this section shall be valid for the same period 8 9 as authorized for full license or certification in this state, 10 unless the person is notified by the credentialing authority that 11 there is cause for a denial of the application or that certain 12 documentation required by this state is lacking or unavailable. In such case, a temporary credential shall be issued to allow the 13 person time to obtain the necessary requirement while continuing to 14 be employed in his or her occupation or profession in this state. 15 Any active duty military applicant receiving a notice of denial of 16 17 full licensure or certification shall have the right to appeal the denial determination as provided in the Administrative Procedures 18 Act or to obtain and submit the documentation required to complete 19 full license or certificate requirements in this state. 20

D. Each credentialing authority in this state shall waive the application fee for active duty military personnel and their spouse and shall further waived the license or certificate fees for the

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first period of issuance for such temporary, reciprocal or comity
license or certificate.

E. Any active duty military personnel who pursuant to any federal or military law, rule or regulation is not required to be licensed or credentialed while employed and performing their occupation or profession only on the premises of an assigned military base shall not be required to be licensed or credentialed in this state pursuant to the same law, rule or regulation.

9 F. Each agency shall promulgate rules to implement the 10 provisions of this section and establish application forms as 11 required.

12 SECTION 3. AMENDATORY Section 8, Chapter 226, O.S.L. 13 2012 (59 O.S. Supp. 2018, Section 4100.7), is amended to read as 14 follows:

Section 4100.7. Nothing in the Post-Military Service 15 Occupation, Education and Credentialing Act shall be construed to 16 require the issuance of any license or certificate to an applicant 17 who does not otherwise meet the stated eligibility standards, 18 criteria, qualifications or requirements for licensure or 19 certification, nor shall the provisions be construed to 20 automatically allow issuance of any license or certificate without 21 testing or examination, without proper consideration by the 22 licensing and examination board, or without proper verification that 23 the applicant is not subject to pending criminal charges or 24

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1	disciplinary actions, has not been convicted of any offense
2	prohibiting licensure or certification, and has no other impairment
3	which would prohibit licensure or certification in this state.
4	SECTION 4. This act shall become effective November 1, 2019.
