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6	An Act relating to soldiers and sailors; amending
7	Section 1, Chapter 394, O.S.L. 2016 (72 O.S. Supp. 2018, Section 34), which relates to interment or
8	cremation assistance for indigent veterans; specifying certain program shall provide
9	reimbursement for unpaid interment or cremation; increasing maximum reimbursement; modifying
10	eligibility requirements for program; and providing an effective date.
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13	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
14	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY Section 1, Chapter 394, O.S.L.
15	2016 (72 O.S. Supp. 2018, Section 34), is amended to read as
16	follows:
17	Section 34. <u>A.</u> The Oklahoma Department of Veterans Affairs
18	shall establish a program to provide assistance for the proper
19	interment or cremation of honorably discharged indigent veterans of
20	the United States Armed Forces. The program shall aid in obtaining
21	any available burial benefits from the United States Department of
22	Veterans Affairs or through private organizations. The program
23	shall provide for a burial grant for any indigent veteran or any
24	person who qualifies for <del>financial assistance</del> <u>reimbursement,</u> as

determined by the Oklahoma Department of Veterans Affairs, for unpaid expenses directly resulting from interment or cremation. Maximum reimbursement shall not exceed Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) per indigent veteran application.

B. Eligibility and approval requirements for the program shall
be as follows:

8 1. The indigent veteran has been determined to be homeless as
9 defined as follows: a homeless veteran is an individual without
10 permanent housing who may live on the streets, stay in a shelter,
11 mission, abandoned building or in any other unstable or non12 permanent situation, and who is eligible under 38 Code of Federal
13 Regulation 38.620;

14 2. The deceased shall be a veteran as defined by 38 U.S.C. 15 101(2) and verified by discharge records. An Oklahoma resident who 16 served in the National Guard or Reserve Component whose only service 17 is active duty training or inactive duty for training but meets all 18 other 38 Code of Federal Regulations 38.620 statutes is eligible for 19 the Indigent Veteran Burial Revolving Fund Section 2 of this title; 20 2. No one shall have claimed the remains of the deceased 21 Veteran; 22 The Veteran shall have died in Oklahoma; 3.

4. The Veteran shall <u>not</u> have been homeless and indigent in the
custody of the Department of Corrections at the time of death;

5. The Veteran's estate did not possess money or other assets
 to pay for or defray funeral expenses The applicant shall provide
 documentation establishing the burial location of the deceased
 Veteran's remains in a cemetery or the location where the deceased
 Veteran's cremains have been permanently placed; and

6 6. There is no other person obligated by law to pay for funeral 7 expenses of the deceased; The applicant shall provide documentation establishing that the deceased Veteran received a proper memorial 8 9 headstone or marker at the place of his or her interment as provided 10 for in Section 2306 of Title 38 of the United States Code or that a 11 memorial headstone or marker meeting the same physical standards for 12 size, material, composition, placement and informational content was 13 provided in the event the deceased Veteran did not qualify under the 14 provisions of Section 2306 of Title 38 of the United States Code.

15 7. C. The Executive Director of the <u>Oklahoma</u> Department of 16 Veterans Affairs or his or her designee shall make final approval of 17 Indigent Veteran Burial Applications<del>;</del>

18 8. The approving authority and shall determine whether the 19 deceased meets eligibility criteria and approves may approve funds 20 to defray burial reimburse the costs. Reimbursement is limited to 21 Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) per application;

22 <u>9. D.</u> Reimbursement will shall be paid from the Indigent
23 Veteran Burial Revolving Fund. If there are insufficient resources
24 in the Indigent Veteran Burial Revolving Fund, payment will shall be

made from the Oklahoma Department of Veterans Affairs Revolving
 Fund; and.

3 10. Once funds are available in the Indigent Veteran Burial
4 Revolving Fund the Oklahoma Department of Veterans Affairs may be
5 reimbursed for payments made from the Oklahoma Department of
6 Veterans Affairs Revolving Fund.

7 <u>E.</u> Rules and application processes for the implementation of
8 this program shall be promulgated by the Executive Director of the
9 Oklahoma Department of Veterans Affairs.

SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2019.
