7 An Act relating to the Child Abuse Prevention Act;
8 providing for dissemination of information related to
9 the termination of parental rights; requiring the
10 State Department of Health to provide birth record
11 information; requiring the Office of Child Abuse
Prevention to include certain statistics in annual
report; providing for review and assessment;
providing for codification; and providing an
effective date.

14 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

15 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
16 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1-227.10 of Title 63, unless
17 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

18 A. The Department of Human Services shall grant access to the
19 Office of Child Abuse Prevention to the identifying information of
20 individuals who have had their parental rights terminated and the
21 conditions which led to the making of the finding which resulted in
22 the termination of the rights of the parent pursuant to the
23 provisions of Section 1-4-502 of Title 10A of the Oklahoma Statutes.

B. The State Department of Health shall supply the Office of Child Abuse Prevention with birth record information for a child born to an individual whose identifying information has been provided under subsection A of this section.

C. The Office of Child Abuse Prevention shall include these statistics in the annual report outlined in Section 1-227.2 of Title 63 of the Oklahoma Statutes.

D. The Office of Child Abuse Prevention or other appropriate division of the State Department of Health shall review the information provided by the Department of Human Services and the Division of Vital Records and, when appropriate and if the resources are available, provide an assessment of the family and offer services if needed.

SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2019.
