7 An Act relating to motor vehicles; amending 47 O.S.
8 2011, Section 14-103A, which relates to movement of
9 manufactured homes; modifying allowable size and
10 width; requiring front and rear escort on certain
11 roadways; allowing only daytime movement on certain
12 roadways; and providing an effective date.

13 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

14 SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 47 O.S. 2011, Section 14-103A, is
15 amended to read as follows:

16 Section 14-103A. A. No combination of a motor vehicle and
17 manufactured home or frame or frames thereof shall have an overall
18 length, inclusive of front and rear bumpers, in excess of seventy
19 (70) feet or a width in excess of ~~sixteen (16)~~ eighteen (18) feet
20 while operating on the system of interstate and defense highways.

21 In determining the width of a manufactured home, the ~~topside overall~~
22 width ~~may~~ shall not exceed the ~~sixteen-foot~~ eighteen-foot width
23 limit ~~by no more than twelve (12) inches on each side for awnings,~~
24 ~~doorknobs, or other fixtures extending beyond the body of the unit.~~

Such combination exceeding seventy (70) feet in length or eight and

1 one-half (8 1/2) feet in width must comply with the provisions of
2 Section 14-118 of this title. A front and rear escort shall be
3 required on the interstate and defense highways for vehicles meeting
4 the parameters of this subsection.

5 B. If any combination of a motor vehicle and manufactured home
6 or frame thereof, exceeds seventy (70) feet in overall length, or
7 eight and one-half (8 1/2) feet in width, they shall be moved only
8 during daylight hours on the system of interstate and defense
9 highways. The towing vehicle must be at least ~~three-fourths (3/4)~~
10 ~~ton~~ three-fourths-ton rated capacity with dual wheels.

11 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2019.
