NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified 20 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 14-135 of Title 70, unless there 21 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows: 22 Subject to the availability of funds, beginning with the 2019-23 2020 school year, the Oklahoma Department of Commerce, in

cooperation with the State Department of Education and the

- 2 | and approve career-readiness assessments and assessment-based
- 3 | credentials that measure and document foundational workplace skills.
- 4 The assessments shall be available to all public school districts to
- 5 administer to all students in grade twelve for the first time in the

- 7 based credential shall be available to any student who achieves the
- 8 prescribed level on the required assessments. If the public school
- 9 district chooses to administer the assessments, the assessments

5	SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 2019.
6	SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
7	of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby
8	declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
9	be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
