16	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 19	0.S.	2011, Section 746, is	
17	amended to read as follows:			
18	Section 746. A. When a person is in the custody of a county			
19	jail, the person shall be primarily responsible for the payment of			
20	the cost of medical care provided to the person for a self-inflicted			
21	injury sustained while in the custody of the county jail or a			
22	condition that was preexisting prior to the arrest of the person and			
23	shall be charged for the medical care	by	the provider of care. The

1 custodial county shall only be liable for the cost of medical care 2 for conditions that are not preexisting:

3 <u>1. The result of a self-inflicted injury sustained while in the</u> 4 custody of a county jail; or

5 <u>2. Preexisting prior to arrest</u>,

6 and that arise due to acts or omissions of the county.

A preexisting condition is a condition for which the person received medical treatment or advice, or a condition which was diagnosed in the six (6) months preceding the custody of the person by the law enforcement agency. An accidental injury sustained during the six (6) months preceding the custody of that person by the law enforcement agency will also be considered a preexisting condition.

B. An inmate in pretrial detention or the custody of a county jail shall be provided with the opportunity to receive necessary medical care for a <u>self-inflicted injury or a</u> preexisting condition and the. The inmate shall be <u>primarily</u> liable for payment of the cost of such medical care including, but not limited to, medication, medical treatment, and transportation costs₇ for or relating to the condition requiring treatment.

C. The medical provider or hospital shall seek payment for all medical care provided for preexisting conditions directly from the offender. In the event there is a dispute between the jail and the medical provider or hospital concerning the existence or extent of a

1 preexisting condition or the liability to pay medical expenses 2 relating to such condition, and the sheriff pays the expense pending 3 a final determination of liability for such medical expense, the 4 court shall order the offender to reimburse the sheriff for all 5 medical care and treatment for preexisting conditions and injuries except for amounts collected pursuant to Section 531 of this title 6 7 The custodial county may seek payment or reimbursement from a person being held in custody and receiving medical care and treatment as 8 9 set forth in Section 979a of Title 22 of the Oklahoma Statutes. 10 Nothing in this section shall require a jail or sheriff to pay 11 disputed medical expenses or expenses for any self-inflicted injury 12 or preexisting condition.

13 Unless a contract exists between a hospital and the county D. 14 for medical care and treatment of inmates in the county jail, a 15 hospital shall accept, as payment in full, reimbursement from the 16 county according to the current fee schedule of the State and 17 Education Employees Group Insurance Board in effect at the time 18 services were rendered; provided that payment of said services is 19 made by the county within forty-five (45) calendar days of 20 submission of a claim by the hospital.
