11	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
12	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
13	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 11-1121 of Title 47, unless
14	there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
15	A law enforcement officer and the employing agency or department
16	shall be immune from civil liability for any damage resulting from
17	the forcible entry into a motor vehicle for the purpose of removing
18	an animal from the motor vehicle if the officer:
19	1. Determines the motor vehicle is locked or there is otherwise
20	no reasonable method for the animal to exit the motor vehicle;
21	2. Has reasonable cause to believe that forcible entry into the
22	motor vehicle is necessary because the animal is in imminent danger

1	and, based upon the circumstances known to the officer at the time,
2	the belief is a reasonable one;
3	3. Places a notice on the motor vehicle windshield with the
4	officer's contact information, the reason the entry was made and the
5	location of the animal;
6	4. Sends the animal to an animal shelter or remains with the
7	animal in a safe location, out of the elements but reasonably close
8	to the motor vehicle; and
9	5. Uses no more force to enter the motor vehicle and remove the
10	animal from the motor vehicle than is necessary under the
11	circumstances.
12	SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2020.
