- SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 100.9 of Title 70, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
- A. The board of education of each school district in this state may adopt a policy regarding sex trafficking and exploitation prevention and education programs for students.
- The board of education of each school district in this state В. may provide schoolwide education programs to all students in grades six through twelve and staff addressing sex trafficking and exploitation prevention and awareness. The board of education of each school district in this state shall, if offered by nonprofit organizations that specialize in outreach and education programs on sex trafficking and exploitation, partner with such organizations and make available to school districts such literature which addresses sex trafficking and exploitation. Such literature and services shall be at no cost to the school districts. literature shall also be made available to the public through the school district website. Beginning with the 2020-2021 school year, every school district may provide a two-hour sex trafficking and exploitation prevention and awareness training program for students which specifically includes the following:

 - 14. Rescuing victims of sex trafficking and exploitation;
- 20 15. How to engage in the fight against sex trafficking and exploitation; or
- 16. Lack of resources and various shortages in the area of rehabilitation and reintegration of sex trafficking victims.

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- C. Program materials related to the sex trafficking and exploitation prevention and education program shall be provided at no cost to the school districts or participating students.
- D. The State Department of Education shall review and publish on its website a list of nonprofit organizations that meet the requirements of this section.
- SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 3250 of Title 70, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
- A. Upon the effective date of this act, the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education shall allow, if offered by nonprofit organizations that specialize in outreach and education programs on sex trafficking and exploitation, a series of in-depth prevention and education programs regarding sex trafficking and exploitation to all freshmen students enrolled at institutions of higher education that are members of The Oklahoma State System of Higher Education.
- B. Institutions of higher education shall provide all freshmen students the opportunity to attend one of three on-campus, voluntary sex trafficking and exploitation prevention and education programs at any time including during freshmen orientation activities, if offered by nonprofit organizations that specialize in outreach and education programs on sex trafficking and exploitation. The sex trafficking and exploitation prevention and education program shall specifically provide students the following:
