AMENDATORY 21 O.S. 2011, Section 1379, is 1.3 amended to read as follows: 14 Section 1379. A. No Except as provided in subsection F of this 15 section, no person shall, without authorization, willfully bypass or 16 go around a security checkpoint when entering any facility requiring 17 persons to pass through a security checkpoint used for inspecting or 18 screening persons or their belongings. 19 B. Every facility requiring persons to pass through a security 20 checkpoint and submit to inspection or screening of their person or 21 belongings shall post notice stating such requirement. All security 22 checkpoints used for persons or their belongings shall be clearly 23 identified as such, and notice shall be posted informing persons

that they and their belongings are subject to search.

- C. No person shall, without authorization, aid or assist any person or persons in bypassing a security checkpoint by opening, holding open, or propping open any secured door, portal, or entryway.
- D. No person shall, without authorization, aid or assist any person or persons in bypassing or avoiding a security checkpoint by passing items or belongings, or receiving items or belongings through a secured door, entryway, window, loading dock, or any other avenue of entry.
- E. All persons approaching a security checkpoint shall obey the lawful requests and orders of security staff present at the checkpoint.
- F. When entering a facility that houses a district court of this state, an attorney licensed to practice law in this state may bypass the security checkpoint upon presentation of an identification card showing active membership in the Oklahoma Bar Association and proof of identity to the security staff present at the checkpoint, unless that person will knowingly have direct contact with a criminal defendant currently in the custody of the state.
- G. Any person convicted of violating the provisions of this section shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and punished by imprisonment in the county jail for not more than one (1) year, by a

1	fine not exceeding One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00), or by both such
2	fine and imprisonment.
3	SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2020.
