AMENDATORY 59 O.S. 2011, Section 632, is 16 amended to read as follows: 17 Section 632. A. The examination of those who desire to 18 practice as osteopathic physicians shall embrace those general 19 subjects and topics, a knowledge of which is commonly and generally 20 required of candidates for a D.O. degree, Doctor of Osteopathy or 21 Doctor of Osteopathic Medicine, by accredited osteopathic colleges 22 in the United States. An examination furnished by the National

Board of Osteopathic Medical Examiners shall be deemed to fulfill

this requirement.

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- B. The applicant may be accepted who has successfully completed the examination sequence of the National Board of Osteopathic Medical Examiners and meets all other requirements.
- exclusive power and authority to determine the qualifications and fitness of all applicants for admission to practice osteopathic medicine in Oklahoma and shall require that each applicant submit to a national criminal history record check as defined in Section 150.9 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes. The Board shall not disseminate criminal history record information resulting from the background check outside of this state.
- D. The Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision has the exclusive power and authority to determine qualifications and fitness of all applicants for admission to practice all professions under the Board's authority and shall require that each applicant submit to a national criminal history record check as defined in Section 150.9 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes. The Board shall not disseminate criminal history record information resulting from the background check outside of this state.
- SECTION 2. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
