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7	An Act relating to schools; authorizing dropout prevention and credit recovery education programs; allowing programs to be offered jointly by school districts and technology centers; listing program requirements; requiring memorandums of understanding regarding program funding; requiring the Oklahoma Department of Career and Technology Education to make monies available, subject to availability of funds; requiring certain funding and expenditure reports; establishing certification requirements for program teachers; providing for codification; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.
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15	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
16	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
L7	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 35e-1 of Title 70, unless there
L8	is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
L 9	A. Pursuant to the availability of funds, beginning with the
20	first semester of the 2020-2021 school year, the Oklahoma Department
21	of Career and Technology Education shall authorize a statewide
22	system of dropout prevention and credit recovery education programs.
23	B. Beginning with the first semester of the 2020-2021 school

year, dropout prevention and credit recovery education programs may

- be offered jointly between an Oklahoma public school and an Oklahoma
 technology center. A program shall:
 - Allow class sizes and student/teacher ratios which are conducive to effective learning for at-risk students;
 - 2. Incorporate appropriate structure, curriculum, and interaction and reinforcement strategies designed to provide effective instruction;
 - 3. Include an intake and screening process to determine eligibility of students;
 - 4. Demonstrate that teaching faculty are appropriately certified teachers;
 - 5. Demonstrate that teaching faculty have been selected on the basis of a record of successful work with at-risk students or personal and educational factors that qualify them for work with at-risk students;
 - 6. Reflect appropriate collaborative efforts with state agencies and local agencies serving youth in the program;
 - 7. Provide courses that meet the academic curricula standards adopted by the State Board of Education and additional remedial courses;
 - 8. Offer individualized instruction;
 - 9. State clear and measurable program goals and objectives;

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- 10. Include counseling and social services components with the provision that providers of services are not required to be certified as school counselors;
- 11. Require a plan leading to graduation be developed for each student in the program which will allow the student to participate in graduation exercises for the school district after meeting the requirements of the school district as specified in the individual graduation plan for that student. The plan shall specifically address whether the student is required to meet the graduation requirements established in Section 11-103.6 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes;
 - 12. Provide a proposed annual budget;
- 13. Include an evaluation component including an annual written self-evaluation;
 - 14. Be appropriately designed to serve secondary school students in grades ten through twelve who are most at risk of not completing a high school education; and
 - 15. Allow students in the dropout prevention and credit recovery program, who otherwise meet all of the participation requirements, to participate in vocational programs and extracurricular activities, including but not limited to athletics, band, and clubs.
- C. For each dropout prevention and credit recovery program, a memorandum of understanding shall be established between the

- participating public school and technology center specifying a

 dedicated percentage of state funding received on a per pupil basis

 that will be attributed to the operation of the program. In

 addition, and subject to the availability of funds, the Oklahoma

 Department of Career and Technology Education shall make monies

 available to approved dropout prevention and credit recovery

 programs.
 - D. By September 15 of each school year, all statewide alternative education funds received and expended for students participating in a dropout prevention and credit recovery program shall be reported to the Oklahoma Department of Career and Technology Education by major object codes and by program classifications pursuant to the Oklahoma Cost Accounting System as adopted by the State Department of Education pursuant to Section 5-135 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes.
 - E. A district board of education of a public school or technology center shall hire only certified teachers to teach in dropout prevention and credit recovery programs. The teacher's certification in subjects in which the teacher does not otherwise hold certification pursuant to the provisions of this section shall be valid only for purposes of teaching in the dropout prevention and credit recovery program.
 - SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 2020.
