- SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
  in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 5019.1 of Title 74, unless there
  is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
  - A. Effective July 1, 2020, the State Historic Preservation

    Office shall no longer be under the jurisdiction of the Oklahoma

    Historical Society and its duties and functions shall be transferred to the Oklahoma Department of Commerce.
  - B. All books, records, papers, equipment and tangible personal property used by the State Historic Preservation Office shall be transferred to the Oklahoma Department of Commerce.
  - C. Personnel assigned to the State Historic Preservation Office shall be transferred to and become employees of the Oklahoma

    Department of Commerce. All personnel transferred pursuant to the provisions of this subsection shall be in the unclassified service for purposes of the Oklahoma Personnel Act.
  - D. Any funds under the control of the State Historic

    Preservation Office, with the exception of funds encumbered prior to
    the effective date of this act, shall be transferred to the Oklahoma

    Department of Commerce.
- E. Any website information which identifies the State Historic
  Preservation Office as an administrative unit of the Oklahoma
  Historical Society shall be modified to reflect the transfer of
  functions required by this act and, if necessary, the Oklahoma
  Department of Commerce shall create a website or modify an existing

- 1 agency website so that the information contained in the existing
- 2 | webpages for the State Historic Preservation Office will be
- 3 preserved to the extent possible and so that the Office is correctly
- 4 | identified as an administrative unit or program of the Oklahoma
- 5 Department of Commerce.
- 6 SECTION 2. AMENDATORY 74 O.S. 2011, Section 840-5.5, as
- 7 | last amended by Section 1, Chapter 365, O.S.L. 2019 (74 O.S. Supp.
- 8 2019, Section 840-5.5), is amended to read as follows:
- 9 Section 840-5.5 A. The following offices, positions, and

- 16 2. Members of boards and commissions, and heads of agencies;
- 17 | also one principal assistant or deputy and one executive secretary
- 18 | for each state agency;
- 3. All judges, elected or appointed, and their employees;
- 4. Persons employed with one-time, limited duration, federal or
- 21 other grant funding that is not continuing or indefinitely
- 22 | renewable. The length of the unclassified employment shall not
- 23 exceed the period of time for which that specific federal funding is
- 24 provided;

- 5. All officers and employees of The Oklahoma State System of Higher Education, State Board of Education and Oklahoma Department of Career and Technology Education;
- 6. Persons employed in a professional or scientific capacity to make or conduct a temporary and special inquiry, investigation, or examination on behalf of the Legislature or a committee thereof or by authority of the Governor. These appointments and authorizations shall terminate on the first day of the regular legislative session immediately following the appointment, if not terminated earlier. However, nothing in this paragraph shall prevent the reauthorization and reappointment of any such person. Any such appointment shall be funded from the budget of the appointing authority;
  - 7. Election officials and employees;

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- 8. Temporary employees employed to work less than one thousand (1,000) hours in any twelve-month period, and seasonal employees employed by the Oklahoma Tourism and Recreation Department pursuant to Section 2241 of this title who work less than one thousand six hundred (1,600) hours in any twelve-month period;
- 9. Department of Public Safety employees occupying the following offices or positions:
  - a. administrative aides to the Commissioner,
  - b. executive secretaries to the Commissioner,
  - c. the Governor's representative of the Oklahoma Highway
    Safety Office who shall be appointed by the Governor,

- 10. Professional trainees only during the prescribed length of their course of training or extension study;
- 11. Students who are employed on a part-time basis, which shall be seventy-five percent (75%) of a normal forty-hour work week or thirty (30) hours per week, or less, or on a full-time basis if the employment is pursuant to a cooperative education program such as that provided for under Title I IV-D of the Higher Education Act of 1965 (20 U.S.C. 1087a-1087c), as amended, and who are regularly enrolled in:
  - an institution of higher learning within The Oklahoma a. State System of Higher Education,
  - an institution of higher learning qualified to become b. coordinated with The Oklahoma State System of Higher Education. For purposes of this section, a student shall be considered a regularly enrolled student if the student is enrolled in a minimum of five (5) hours of accredited graduate courses or a minimum of ten

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(10) hours of accredited undergraduate courses; provided, however, the student shall only be required to be enrolled in a minimum of six (6) hours of accredited undergraduate courses during the summer, or

high school students regularly enrolled in a high school in Oklahoma and regularly attending classes during such time of enrollment;

12. The spouses of personnel who are employed on a part-time basis to assist or work as a relief for their spouses in the Oklahoma Tourism and Recreation Department;

13. Service substitute attendants who are needed to replace museum and site attendants who are unavoidably absent. Service substitutes may work as part-time or full-time relief for absentees for a period of not more than four (4) weeks per year in the Oklahoma Historical Society sites and museums; such substitutes will not count towards the agency's full-time-equivalent (FTE) employee limit;

Permanent classified employees may request a leave of absence from classified status and accept an unclassified appointment and compensation as an acting incumbent with the same agency; provided, the leave shall expire no later than two (2) years from the date of the acting incumbent appointment. An appointing authority may establish unclassified positions and appoint unclassified employees to perform the duties of a permanent classified employee who is on leave of absence from a classified position to serve as an acting incumbent. All unclassified appointments created pursuant to this paragraph shall expire no later than two (2) years from the date of appointment. Classified employees accepting unclassified appointments and compensation pursuant to this paragraph shall be entitled to participate without interruption in any benefit programs available to classified employees, including retirement and insurance programs. Immediately upon termination of an unclassified appointment pursuant to this paragraph, an employee on assignment from the classified service shall have a right to be restored to the classified service and reinstated to the former job family level and compensation plus any

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1 adjustments and increases in salary or benefits which the employee would have received but for the leave of absence; 3 50. State Board of Licensure for Professional Engineers and 14 Land Surveyors personnel occupying the following offices and 15 positions: 16 one Director of Enforcement, and 17 b. two Board Investigators; 18 One Information Systems Data Management Analyst of the 19 State and Education Employees Group Insurance Board; 20 Office of Juvenile Affairs personnel occupying the 21 following offices and positions: 22 two Management Information Systems positions, and

employees hired for service at the Southwest Oklahoma

Juvenile Center in Manitou after June 1, 2020, as

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provided in subsection C of Section 2-7-202 of Title

10A of the Oklahoma Statutes; and

- 55. Heads of agencies, principal assistants or deputies and executive secretaries of an agency that is consolidated into another agency.
- B. If an agency has the authority to employ personnel in the following offices and positions, the appointing authority shall have the discretion to appoint personnel to the unclassified service:
- Licensed medical doctors, osteopathic physicians, dentists, psychologists, and nurses;
  - 2. Certified public accountants;
  - 3. Licensed attorneys;

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- 4. Licensed veterinarians; and
- 5. Licensed pharmacists.
- C. Effective July 1, 1996, authorization for unclassified offices, positions, or personnel contained in a bill or joint resolution shall terminate June 30 of the ensuing fiscal year after the authorization unless the authorization is codified in the Oklahoma Statutes or the termination is otherwise provided in the legislation.
- D. The appointing authority of agencies participating in the statewide information systems project may establish unclassified positions and appoint unclassified employees to the project as needed. Additional unclassified positions may be established, if

required, to appoint an unclassified employee to perform the duties of a permanent classified employee who is temporarily absent from a classified position as a result of assignment to this project. All unclassified appointments under this authority shall expire no later than December 31, 2007, and all unclassified positions established to support the project shall be abolished. Both the positions and appointments resulting from this authority shall be exempt from any agency FTE limitations and any limits imposed on the number of unclassified positions authorized. Permanent classified employees may request a leave of absence from classified status and accept an unclassified appointment and compensation with the same agency under the provisions of this subsection; provided, the leave shall expire no later than December 31, 2007. Employees accepting the appointment and compensation shall be entitled to participate without interruption in any benefit programs available to classified employees, including retirement and insurance programs. Immediately upon termination of an unclassified appointment pursuant to this subsection, an employee on assignment from the classified service shall have a right to be restored to the classified service and reinstated to the former job family level and compensation plus any adjustments and increases in salary or benefits which the employee would have received but for the leave of absence.

SECTION 3. This act shall become effective July 1, 2020.
