A new section of law to be codified NEW LAW 18 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 4-120.11 of Title 26, unless 19 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows: 20 The Secretary of the State Election Board is hereby 21 authorized to conduct a data validation of the state voter 22 registration database with other state or federal databases that 23 contain information regarding the citizenship status of a person.

The Secretary may utilize the Office of Management and Enterprise

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- Services to ensure the security of the data being validated. Any
 state agency requested to participate in the data validation
 pursuant to this section shall be required to cooperate unless
 specifically prohibited by federal law. The Secretary of the State
 Election Board shall conduct the data validation pursuant to this
 section no later than June 30, 2020, and at least once every two (2)
 years thereafter.
 - B. Persons who are identified in the data validation pursuant to this section as potentially being noncitizens and who are registered to vote shall be reported to the district attorney in the county in which the voter is registered. Upon being notified by the Secretary of the State Election Board about persons who are potentially noncitizens and who are registered to vote, the district attorney shall investigate and notify the Secretary within sixty (60) days of the disposition of each investigation.
 - C. The Secretary of the State Election Board shall provide a report on the results of the data validation to the Governor, the President Pro Tempore of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives no later than December 31 of any year in which the data validation is conducted.
 - D. Personal information, including the name, address and birthdate of persons included in the data validation, shall not be subject to the Oklahoma Open Records Act and shall not be made public except by an order of the court. The total number of

1	potential identifications reported to each district attorney shall
2	be a matter of public record.
3	E. The Secretary of the State Election Board shall promulgate
4	rules and shall prescribe materials necessary for the implementation
5	of this section.
6	SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2019.
