NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified 18 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 11-103.6a-2 of Title 70, unless 19 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows: 20 Α. The State Board of Education, in consultation with the State 21 Regents for Higher Education and the State Board of Career and 22 Technology Education, shall conduct a study and make recommendations 23 to the Legislature regarding possible changes to the units or sets 24 of competencies required for students to graduate with a standard

- diploma as provided in Section 11-103.6 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma

  Statutes. The purpose of the study shall be to ensure students

  receive a well-rounded education and give school districts, schools

  and ultimately students greater flexibility in choosing courses that

  are aligned to a student's academic and career goals as provided in
- B. The study shall include, but is not limited to, review of the extent to which the following principles exist in the current graduation requirements and recommendations for improvement:

Section 1210.508-4 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes.

- Course options lead to a well-rounded education, promoting an engaged and informed citizenry;
- 12 2. The high school experience is relevant for students'
  13 futures;
- 3. Diploma requirements are aligned to college and career readiness;
  - 4. Diploma requirements effectively serve the needs of students with disabilities;
  - 5. Course options have appropriate rigor to prepare students for their next steps after high school graduation;
  - 6. Units or sets of competencies are aligned, to the extent necessary, to career pathways between common education, career and technology education and higher education;
- 7. Personalized learning and personalized pathways to graduation are available to students;

- 8. Access to and use of apprenticeships, internships and mentorships as provided in Section 1210.528-1 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes;
  - 9. Access to advanced coursework, including, but not limited to, concurrent or dual enrollment and advanced placement courses;
  - 10. Access to career and technology education courses that lead to industry certification; and
  - 11. Feasibility of incorporating new units or sets of competencies, including computer science, health education and personal financial literacy.
  - C. The Board shall engage stakeholders in crafting any recommendations, which shall include educators, business members and community partners.
  - D. The Board shall submit any recommendations prior to the start of the 2021 Legislative Session and may continue the study and to make recommendations thereafter as needed.
  - SECTION 2. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
