11 An Act relating to schools; authorizing school
12 district boards to adopt policies regarding sex
13 trafficking and exploitation prevention and awareness
14 education programs for students; allowing school
15 districts to offer certain students education
16 programs; directing school districts to partner with
17 nonprofit organizations that will provide programs
18 and curriculum without cost to school districts;
19 providing list of topics included in programs;
20 providing program materials to school district and
21 participating students at no cost; allowing certain
22 nonprofit organizations to present sex trafficking
23 and exploitation prevention and education programs at
24 institutions of higher education; directing
 institutions of higher education to provide freshmen
 students the opportunity to attend sex trafficking
 and exploitation prevention and education programs
 during freshmen orientation; providing list of topics
 included in programs; providing program materials to
 students at no cost; requiring program provider to
 incur costs of implementing prevention and education
 programs and program materials; providing for
 codification; and providing an effective date.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

2 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
3 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 100.9 of Title 70, unless there
4 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

5 A. The board of education of each school district in this state
6 may adopt a policy regarding sex trafficking and exploitation
7 prevention and education programs for students.

8 B. The board of education of each school district in this state
9 may provide school-wide education programs to all students in grades
10 ten through twelve and staff addressing sex trafficking and
11 exploitation prevention and awareness. The board of education of
12 each school district in this state shall partner with nonprofit
13 organizations that specialize in outreach and education programs on
14 sex trafficking and exploitation and make available to school
15 districts curriculum which addresses sex trafficking and
16 exploitation, without cost to the school districts. The course
17 outline for the curriculum shall be made available to the public
18 through the school district website. Beginning with the 2020-2021
19 school year, every school district may provide a two-hour sex
20 trafficking and exploitation prevention and awareness training
21 program for students which specifically includes the following:

- 22 1. Definitions and nature of sex trafficking and exploitation;
23 2. Current laws of sex trafficking and exploitation in
24 Oklahoma;

1 3. Facts and statistics of sex trafficking and exploitation in
2 Oklahoma and throughout the United States;

3 4. How sex traffickers profile victims;

4 5. The role of online computer activity;

5 6. How demand is created and the industries that influence sex
6 trafficking and exploitation;

7 7. How to identify a potential victim and what to do when a
8 person identifies a victim;

9 8. Understanding force, fraud and coercion;

10 9. Understanding how traffickers groom a victim;

11 10. The differences between prostitution and sex trafficking
12 and exploitation;

13 11. The role that pornography plays in sex trafficking and
14 exploitation;

15 12. Understanding the complexities of abuse, indoctrination and
16 manipulation;

17 13. Understanding the physiological makeup of a sex trafficking
18 victim;

19 14. Rescuing victims of sex trafficking and exploitation;

20 15. How to engage in the fight against sex trafficking and
21 exploitation; or

22 16. Lack of resources and various shortages in the area of
23 rehabilitation and reintegration of sex trafficking victims.

1 C. Program materials related to the sex trafficking and
2 exploitation prevention and education program shall be provided at
3 no cost to the school districts or participating students.

4 SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
5 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 3250 of Title 70, unless there
6 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

7 A. Upon the effective date of this act, the Oklahoma State
8 Regents for Higher Education shall allow nonprofit organizations
9 that specialize in outreach and education programs on sex
10 trafficking and exploitation to present a series of in-depth
11 prevention and education programs regarding sex trafficking and
12 exploitation to all freshmen students enrolled at institutions of
13 higher education that are members of The Oklahoma State System of
14 Higher Education.

15 B. Institutions of higher education shall provide all freshmen
16 students the opportunity to attend one of three on-campus, voluntary
17 sex trafficking and exploitation prevention and education programs
18 during freshmen orientation activities. The sex trafficking and
19 exploitation prevention and education program shall specifically
20 provide students the following:

- 21 1. Definitions and nature of sex trafficking and exploitation;
- 22 2. Current laws of sex trafficking and exploitation in
23 Oklahoma;

1 3. Facts and statistics of sex trafficking and exploitation in
2 Oklahoma and throughout the United States;

3 4. How sex traffickers profile victims;

4 5. The role of online computer activity;

5 6. How demand is created and the industries that influence sex
6 trafficking and exploitation;

1 C. Program materials related to sex trafficking and
2 exploitation prevention and education programs shall be provided at
3 no cost to participating students. The program provider shall be
4 solely responsible for incurring all costs associated with
5 implementing prevention and education programs and related program
6 materials.

7 SECTION 3. This act shall become effective November 1, 2020.
