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1 WHEREAS, in 2011, the United States Supreme Court ruled in
2 *Bruesewitz v. Wyeth* that the National Childhood Vaccine Injury Act
3 preempts all design defect claims against vaccine manufacturers
4 brought by plaintiffs who seek compensation for injury or death
5 caused by vaccine side effects; and

6 WHEREAS, our individual human rights should outweigh the profits
7 of pharmaceutical companies, and individuals should have the ability
8 to hold vaccine manufacturers liable for design defects that result
9 in adverse side effects from vaccines; and

10 WHEREAS, the European Union has found a way to allow evidence-
11 based lawsuits holding vaccine manufacturers liable without
12 destabilizing the European health care system.

13 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES
14 OF THE 2ND SESSION OF THE 57TH OKLAHOMA LEGISLATURE, THE SENATE
15 CONCURRING THEREIN:

16 THAT the Oklahoma Legislature urges the President and the
17 Congress of the United States to pass legislation removing 42
18 U.S.C., Section 300aa-22(b)(1) from law and allowing design defect
19 claims against vaccine manufacturers by individuals who have
20 experienced adverse side effects caused by vaccines.

21 THAT the Oklahoma Secretary of State is directed to prepare
22 copies of this resolution and transmit them to the President of the
23 United States, the President and Secretary of the United States
24 Senate, the Speaker and Clerk of the United States House of

1 Representatives, the Secretary of the United States Department of
2 Health and Human Services, and the Oklahoma Congressional
3 Delegation.
