11	A Joint Resolution directing the Secretary of State
12	to refer to the people for their approval or rejection a proposed amendment to Section 17A of
13	Article V of the Constitution of the State of Oklahoma; modifying limitation on time served in the
14	Legislature; providing ballot title; and directing filing.
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17	BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES AND THE SENATE OF THE
18	1ST SESSION OF THE 57TH OKLAHOMA LEGISLATURE:
19	SECTION 1. The Secretary of State shall refer to the people for
20	their approval or rejection, as and in the manner provided by law,
21	the following proposed amendment to Section 17A of Article V of the
22	Constitution of the State of Oklahoma to read as follows:
23	Section 17A. Any member of the Legislature who is elected to
24	office after the effective date of this amendment January 1 of the

1	year following the adoption of this amendment shall be eligible to
2	serve no more than $\frac{12}{20}$ years in <u>both houses of</u> the Oklahoma State
3	Legislature; provided a member of the Legislature shall be eligible
4	to serve no more than 12 years in either the Senate or the House of
5	Representatives. Years in Legislative office need not be
6	consecutive and years of service in both the Senate and the House of
7	Representatives shall be added together and included in determining
8	the total number of Legislative years in office. The years served
9	by any member elected or appointed to serve less than a full
10	Legislative term to fill a vacancy in office shall not be included
11	in the 12-year limitation set forth herein; but no member who has
12	completed 12 years the maximum number of years in office <u>allowed by</u>
13	this section shall thereafter be eligible to serve a partial term.
14	Any member who is serving a Legislative term in office or who has
15	been elected or appointed to serve a term in office on the effective
16	date hereof shall be entitled to complete his or her term and shall
17	be eligible to serve an additional 12 years thereafter. This
18	amendment shall be effective on the 1st day of the year following
19	its adoption.
20	SECTION 2. The Ballot Title for the proposed Constitutional
21	amendment as set forth in SECTION 1 of this resolution shall be in
22	the following form:

1	THE GIST OF THE PROPOSITION IS AS FOLLOWS:
2	This measure amends the Oklahoma Constitution. It changes the
3	total number of years a person can serve in the Oklahoma
4	Legislature. Currently, the maximum number of years a person
5	can serve is 12 years. The amendment would change the maximum
6	number of years to 20 years but would limit the number of years
7	a person could serve in either the Senate or the House of
8	Representatives to 12 years.
9	SHALL THE PROPOSAL BE APPROVED?

12	SECTION 3. The Chief Clerk of the House of Representatives,
13	immediately after the passage of this resolution, shall prepare and
