12 An Act relating to state purchasing procedures;
13 amending 74 O.S. 2011, Section 85.3A, as last amended
14 by Section 9, Chapter 269, O.S.L. 2016 (74 O.S. Supp.
15 2018, Section 85.3A), which relates to The Oklahoma
16 Central Purchasing Act; modifying exempt agencies;
17 providing for certain preference to honorably
18 discharged veterans; defining term; providing for
19 codification; providing an effective date; and
20 declaring an emergency.

21 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

22 SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 74 O.S. 2011, Section 85.3A, as
23 last amended by Section 9, Chapter 269, O.S.L. 2016 (74 O.S. Supp.
24 2018, Section 85.3A), is amended to read as follows:

 Section 85.3A A. Compliance with the provisions of The
Oklahoma Central Purchasing Act shall not be required of:

1 1. County government;

2 2. The Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education, the
3 institutions, centers, or other constituent agencies of The Oklahoma
4 State System of Higher Education;

5 3. The telecommunications network known as OneNet;

6 4. The Department of Public Safety gun range;

7 5. The State Treasurer for the following purchases:

8 a. services, including, but not limited to, legal
9 services to assist in the administration of the
10 Uniform Unclaimed Property Act, as provided in Section
11 668 of Title 60 of the Oklahoma Statutes, and

12 b. software, hardware and associated services to assist
13 in the administration of funds and securities held by
14 the state, as provided in Section 71.2 of Title 62 of
15 the Oklahoma Statutes; ~~or~~

16 6. CompSource Oklahoma if CompSource Oklahoma is operating
17 pursuant to a pilot program authorized by Sections 3316 and 3317 of
18 this title; or

19 7. The Oklahoma Department of Veterans Affairs, in accordance
20 with Section 2 of this act.

21 B. The State Purchasing Director may form an advisory committee
22 consisting of representatives from entities exempted from the
23 provisions of The Oklahoma Central Purchasing Act. The purpose of
24 the committee shall be to allow committee members to provide input

1 into the development of shared state purchasing contracts,
2 collaboratively participate in the integration of their purchasing
3 platforms or electronic purchasing catalogs, analyze solutions that
4 may be used by state government to meet the purchasing needs of the
5 entities, explore joint purchases of general use items that result
6 in mutual procurement of quality goods and services at the lowest
7 reasonable cost and explore flexibility, administrative relief, and
8 transformation changes through utilization of procurement
9 technology.

10 C. At the invitation of the State Purchasing Director entities
11 exempted from the provisions of The Oklahoma Central Purchasing Act
12 shall participate in the advisory committee referenced in subsection
13 B of this section.

14 D. The State Purchasing Director may invite representatives of
15 local government and local common education entities to participate
16 as members of the advisory committee.

17 SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
18 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 63.22 of Title 74, unless there
19 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

20 A. The Oklahoma Department of Veterans Affairs may grant a
21 preference for purposes of the expenditure of funds for tangible or
22 intangible personal property or services to be acquired by the
23 agency to an honorably discharged veteran or to a lawfully
24 recognized business entity the majority ownership of which, fifty-

1 one percent (51%) or more, is held by an honorably discharged
2 veteran at the time the contract is awarded.

3 B. No individual veteran or veteran-owned business entity, as
4 defined in subsection A of this section, shall be eligible for
5 consideration as a veteran vendor pursuant to this section unless
6 the individual veteran or veteran-owned business entity has
7 registered with the federal System for Award Management (SAM.gov) in
8 the same manner as required to do business with the federal
9 government or has met alternate requirements for qualification or
10 substantiation as established by the Oklahoma Department of Veterans
11 Affairs.

12 C. As used in this section, the term "veteran" shall be defined
13 in accordance with Section 2 of Title 72 of the Oklahoma Statutes.

14 D. The Oklahoma Department of Veterans Affairs may promulgate
15 rules for implementing the provisions of this section.

16 SECTION 3. This act shall become effective July 1, 2019.

17 SECTION 4. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
18 of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby
19 declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
20 be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
