9       An Act relating to commercial driver licenses;  
10      providing for certain hazardous materials endorsement  
11      exemption; providing for codification; providing an  
12      effective date; and declaring an emergency.

13   BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

14       SECTION 1.       NEW LAW       A new section of law to be codified  
15      in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 230.17 of Title 47, unless there  
16      is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

17       A.   Any person driving under a commercial Class A license shall  
18      not be required to obtain a hazardous materials endorsement pursuant  
19      to 49 C.F.R. Section 383 if the person is:

20       1.   Acting within the scope of the license holder's employment  
21      as an employee of a custom harvester operation, agrichemical  
22      business, farm retail outlet and supplier or livestock feeder;

1        2. Is operating a service vehicle that is transporting diesel  
2 in a quantity of three thousand seven hundred eighty-five (3,785)  
3 liters or one thousand (1,000) gallons or less; and

4        3. Is clearly marked with a "flammable" or "combustible"  
5 placard as appropriate.

6        SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 2019.

7        SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation  
8 of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby  
9 declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and  
10 be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
