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9 An Act relating to schools; directing the State
10 Department of Education to develop certain rubric by
11 certain date; providing contents for rubric;
12 requiring certain courses to be aligned to certain
13 standards and instructional practices; providing
14 certain construction; directing the State Board of
15 Education, subject to legislative appropriations, to
16 allocate certain amount of funds to develop certain
17 professional learning opportunities; allowing the
18 Department to create a grant program; providing
19 eligibility criteria to receive grant funds;
20 providing for use of funds; allowing grant funds to
21 be used to purchase certain technology; requiring
22 grant applications to include certain specification;
23 directing the Department to prioritize grant
24 applications based on certain criteria; providing for
promulgation of rules; providing for codification;
providing an effective date; and declaring an
emergency.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

1 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
2 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 11-103.6m of Title 70, unless
3 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

4 A. The State Department of Education shall develop by December
5 31, 2019, a rubric for computer science programs in elementary,
6 middle and high schools to serve as a guide to schools for
7 implementing quality computer science programs.

8 B. The rubric shall include but not be limited to the following
9 recommendations:

10 1. No less than one computer science course taught by a teacher
11 with a computer science certification at each school site, which may
12 include core content courses where computer science concepts are
13 integrated; and

14 2. Allowing all students to have access to career exploration
15 activities that address how computer science skills are utilized.

16 C. Each course or offering shall be aligned to the Oklahoma
17 Academic Standards for Computer Science and current research-based
18 instructional practices.

19 D. The provisions of this section shall not be construed to
20 mean that courses may not be taught in a virtual, distance,
21 integrated or other innovative setting.

22 SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
23 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 11-103.6n of Title 70, unless
24 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

1 A. Subject to legislative appropriations, One Million Dollars
2 (\$1,000,000.00) shall be allocated by the State Board of Education
3 to develop and implement high quality professional learning
4 opportunities for computer science courses that align to the
5 Oklahoma Academic Standards for Computer Science and align to the
6 rubric developed by the State Department of Education for quality
7 computer science programs pursuant to Section 1 of this act.

8 B. The State Department of Education may create a grant program
9 for the purpose of providing professional learning opportunities.
10 Entities eligible to receive grant funds shall include but not be
11 limited to:

- 12 1. A school district or a consortium of school districts; and
13 2. High-quality computer science professional learning
14 providers including institutions within The Oklahoma State System of
15 Higher Education, technology center schools overseen by the Oklahoma
16 State Board of Career and Technology Education, non-profit
17 organizations or private entities.

18 C. Grant funds shall be used by grantees for:

- 19 1. High-quality professional learning for kindergarten through
20 twelfth grade computer science content including travel to
21 workshops;
22 2. Credentialing for kindergarten through twelfth grade
23 computer science teachers including career and technology education
24 endorsements and academic supplemental endorsements;

1 3. Supports for kindergarten through twelfth grade computer
2 science professional learning including mentoring and coaching;

3 4. Creation of instructional resources to support
4 implementation including integrated curricular resources; and

5 5. Developing or redesigning computer science resources that
6 are aligned with the Oklahoma Academic Standards for Computer
7 Science.

8 Up to ten percent (10%) of grant funds may be used to study the
9 effectiveness of professional learning, curricula or other
10 initiatives provided for in this subsection.

11 D. A grantee may use grant funds to purchase technology
12 including software, hardware or infrastructure, provided it is
13 directly connected to the grantee's ability to implement a quality
14 computer science program as defined by the rubric required by
15 Section 1 of this act. To use grant funds for technology, a grantee
16 shall specify in the grant application the amount of funds to be
17 used for technology and the items to be purchased.

18 E. The State Department of Education shall prioritize the
19 following grant applications:

20 1. School districts that are working in partnership with
21 providers of high-quality professional learning for kindergarten
22 through twelfth grade computer science;

23 2. Proposals that describe strategies to enroll underserved
24 populations of students; and

1 3. Proposals from rural or urban areas with low penetration of
2 kindergarten through twelfth grade computer science offerings
3 including school districts that partner together to form clusters of
4 implementation.

5 F. The State Board of Education shall promulgate rules to
6 implement the provisions of this act.

7 SECTION 3. This act shall become effective July 1, 2019.

8 SECTION 4. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
9 of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby
10 declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
11 be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
